- **Disclosures** of exparte conversations **is not** required in Legislative process; disclosures of conflict of interest **is** required.
- Public Comment Non-received as part of land use notice- project outreach comments incorporated into the final report.

- The Oregon City Loop Trail Refinement Plan analyzes existing conditions and provides direction for future development, funding, and needs for several segments of the previously adopted Loop Trail.
- The Oregon City Loop Trail Refinement Plan will be added to the Oregon City Transportation System Plan, an ancillary document to the Comprehensive Plan.

Why is this coming to the Planning Commission?

Local governments should plan public services in accordance with the community's needs as a whole rather than be forced to respond to individual developments as they occur.

Last remaining segments that have yet to be planned inside city limits

Adoption of the plan provides:

- Staff can require dedication and/or development associated with land use applications
- Necessary details to apply for competitive grants for one or more of the segments

CRITERIA FOR APPROVAL

Chapter 17.68 - Zoning Changes and Comprehensive Plan Amendments 0C2040 Oregon City Comprehensive Plan, Policies, and Strategies



- Providing safe connections between neighborhoods, commercial centers, and community amenities helps encourage residents to walk or bike for shorter trips.
- •Help reduce the number of vehicle miles traveled and decrease the overall dependence on vehicles as the only feasible mode of transportation.
- The loop trail segments are located in the city's southern section within existing residential areas developed from the 1970s to the 2000s. These areas have traditionally received less attention for pedestrian and bike improvements.
- Staff found the application met all criteria and helps to implement the OC 2040 policies

Community Outreach

Opportunities for community members to participate included:

- Online survey live from September 9th to October 3rd, 2022.
 - Promoted with a postcard and on City's social media
- In-Person Workshop October 10th, 2022.
 - Held at Gaffney Lane Elementary
 - 24 Attendees
 - Shared opportunities and constraints for Meyers-Beavercreek and included walking audit





- Proposed cross-section provides a 10' shared-use path
- Will widen and pave existing path
- Uses space between the school playground and residential homes
- Enhances connection to planned Meyers-Beavercreek Trail





- Near-term options use existing sidewalks and bicycle lanes on Beavercreek and Molalla to make connections in the near-term
- Long-term vision would create a path outside the existing roadway between Beavercreek & Frontier Parkway
- Proposed cross-section provides a 12' shared-use path



- Proposing to move the existing curb and remove existing on-street bicycle lanes
- Create a 12' shared-use path on the north side
- Maintain existing sidewalks on the south side
- Off-street connection would qualify for trails funding







- Proposed concept maintains the existing roadway cross-section
- People walking will use existing sidewalks
- Vehicle travel lane will be shared with people riding bicycles
- New roadway connections should be built with the same cross-section
