

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1463

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE REGARDING ELECTIONS
AND THE INITIATIVE AND REFERENDUM POWERS.

WHEREAS, Chapter IV of the Milwaukie Charter and
Ordinance No. 735 provide for local elections and

WHEREAS, recent changes in state elections law have
preempted portions of Ordinance No. 735, and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to conform city election
procedures to state law, now therefore,

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Recorder is designated the local
elections officer for the purpose of carrying out the
election function under state law.


Section 2. Signatures of 15% of the qualified voters
of the city shall be required to propose legislation by
initiative petition and the signatures of 10% of the
qualified voters of the city shall be required to order a
referendum on any legislation. The total number of
qualified voters shall be determined as of the date of
the last general election.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 735 is repealed.


Read the first time on June 16, 1980, and moved
