TO THE HONORABLE MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL, AND CITY MANAGER:

This 1984-1985 Annual Report is submitted to you by the Hillsboro Public Library. The purpose of our report is to provide a brief review of library activities this past year and to offer a statistical comparison of our programs for the previous five years.

1984-1985 has been a productive year for the library. Our circulation of library materials has increased by 7.09% over 1983-1984. We added 6,724 new titles to our collection during the year; therefore, we were able to fill in areas of our collection that were lacking as a result of a reduced budget in 1982-1983. Our hours have expanded to include service four evenings a week in addition to daytime and Saturday hours.

We have offered a variety of programs during the year for both children and adults. Among these programs were a Tenth Anniversary Celebration to commemorate the move into our new building in 1975 and an evening party for the Hispanic community to introduce them to our expanded Hispanic collection.

We are proud of the services that the Hillsboro Public Library is able to provide to our community and to Washington County. Your continued support and assistance help make these services possible. On behalf of the Hillsboro Library staff I would like to express our appreciation for your interest, support, and assistance which have enabled us to provide quality library service for our patrons.


