CONTINUATION OF
JUNE 16, 1980 MEETING

A continuation of the June 16, 1980 Council meeting was held at 7 p.m. June 19, 1980 with the following councilpersons present:

The meeting was called to meet with downtown merchants at their request, to discuss requests they have made. Burgess called the meeting to order as Council President, in the Mayor's absence at the start of the meeting.

Ron Olson, Olson's Variety, presented a petition signed by downtown merchants requesting the city revert to a two-way street system in the downtown area.

(Manuel entered the meeting at 7:15 p.m.)

Speaking in favor of the change:

Ray Renfrow, Perry's Pharmacy, said he is in favor of the best traffic flow possible.

Roland Heydel, Pickle Barrel

Paul Graham, Graham's Book and Stationery, said he had signed the petition in the "no" column, but is speaking in favor

Ron Olson, Olson's Variety, presented a petition signed by downtown merchants requesting a change in the present city ordinance that would allow placing merchandise on the sidewalk.

(Meeting recessed at 8:15 p.m., reconvened at 8:22 p.m. with all present.)

It was MOVED by Nickel, SECONDED by Ewald, to read (AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE REPEALING SECTION 5 (6) OF ORDINANCE NO. 1257) the first time by title only.

It was MOVED by Manuel, SECONDED by Nickel to amend the ordinance by inserting an emergency clause. After discussion, Nickel withdrew her second, and Manuel withdrew the motion.

On the main motion, MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

It was MOVED by Nickel, SECONDED by Paulson, to read the ordinance the second time by title only. MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

It was MOVED by Nickel, SECONDED by Paulson, to adopt the ordinance.

It was MOVED by Nickel, SECONDED by Paulson, to amend the motion to include an emergency clause in the ordinance. Nickel requested the minutes show the Council does not use the emergency clause frivolously, but she considers this a unique situation--the Council is doing it to support the merchants and allow placing merchandise on the sidewalk during Festival Daze, starting June 20, and the ordinance would not be effective for 30 days without the emergency clause. MOTION CARRIED with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Paulson, Nickel and Burgess. NOES: Manuel and Ewald. Manuel said his vote had nothing to do with the ordinance or the emergency clause; but he thought the process was less than forthright.

Ordinance 1466 was put on its passage with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Paulson, Nickel and Burgess. NOES: Manuel and Ewald. Ordinance 1466 passed the Council, and was so declared by the Council President.

It was Council consensus that the merchants organization draw up rules for control of merchandise on the sidewalks.

DOWNTOWN LANDSCAPING

Downtown merchants agreed to water and weed the planters adjacent to their business premises.

STREET CLEANING

Manager said the city would like to run the street sweeper more often, but cannot with present manpower. He would like this brought up during next budget discussions.

DOWNTOWN PARKING

Merchants suggested several solutions to inadequate downtown parking: 1) stricter enforcement, 2) angle parking on 21st Street and side streets, 3) a sign indicating there is no longer a bus stop alongside Perry's Pharmacy, and parking is permitted, 4) more all-day parking close to downtown, 5) city lease land for parking.

REQUEST TO RETURN TO TWO-WAY STREETS

It was Council consensus that no action be taken at this time, and that city staff look into getting some professional analysis.

OTHER BUSINESS

1. Mrs. Boehm asked if something could be done about the lights that are out on Main Street, and the bolts left sticking up.
2. Roland Heydel asked that signs be put up on McLoughlin, pointing to downtown Milwaukie or downtown shopping area.
3. Festival Daze Association has sent letter and certificate of appreciation to City Council.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ON CONSOLIDATION

It was MOVED by Nickel, SECONDED by Manuel, to extend the meeting for five minutes. MOTION CARRIED with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Paulson, Nickel and Manuel. NOES: Burgess and Ewald.

It was MOVED by Nickel, SECONDED by Manuel, to accept the Inter-governmental Cooperation Agreement with Clackamas County on the formation of a joint charter advisory committee on the proposed consolidation of Milwaukie with certain unincorporated areas, with the following changes:


Last full sentence on page one shall read: "Decisions shall be made by a majority vote of the members."

First two lines on page two shall read: "...to the Oregon Public Meetings Law and shall be held within the City or the County at a place and a time convenient to the public."

The last sentence in Section 3 on page two shall read: "All expenses of the Committee shall be approved in advance and shared equally by the City and County."

MOTION CARRIED with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Nickel, Manuel and Ewald. NOES: Paulson and Burgess.

The meeting adjourned at 10:07 p.m.
