The invocation was given by the Reverend Orville Markgraf, Emanuel Lutheran Church, and the pledge of allegiance was recited.

Councilwoman Burgess asked that item e be removed for discussion, Councilman Englund that item d be discussed, and Councilman Hutchison that item c be discussed.

b) Council has received memorandum from Manager, dated April 14, 1975, concerning annual verified statement of economic interest.

c) Council has received copy of memorandum from CRAG, dated March 31, 1975, re time schedule and process used to adopt a plan

d) Council has received copy of memorandum from City Attorney, dated April 4, 1975, re Chapter 70 of the Uniform Building Code. Councilman Englund asked that this be on the agenda at a later meeting, with reference to whether the city followed the state regulations on amendments to the UBC.

e) Council has received memorandum from Public Works Director, dated April 17, 1975, listing progress payment for work completed under the terms of agreement with Clackamas Enterprises, Inc., for sewer extensions - 40th and Edison Street, in the amount of \$12,151.87.

f) Council has received copy of letter from Manager to Senator Packwood, dated April 10, 1975, concerning Housing and Community Development Act, and the same letter addressed to Representative Duncan and Senator Hatfield.

g) Council has received copy of letter from Manager to Director of Department of Land Conservation and Development, dated April 11, giving suggestions for criteria to be used for allowing extension for compliance with LCDC goals.

It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Hutchison, that the consent calendar be adopted. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

PUBLIC HEARING -- HOLLYBERRY APPEAL

(Meeting recessed at 7:30 p. m. , reconvened at 7:50 p. m. with all present.)

The public hearing was postponed until all parties to the controversy could meet elsewhere and come to a conclusion.

CORRESPONDENCE

1. Council has received copies of memorandum from Councilwoman Burgess, dated April 15, 1975, concerning budget elections. Mrs. Burgess asked for appointment of a committee to research how other cities handle election promotion. She stressed her feeling that neighborhood council program should not be set up until an additional staff person not now on the payroll could be obtained, through federal funding, to coordinate the program.

It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Hutchison, that a citizens committee be appointed to help breach the gap of communication between now and possibly the end of the fiscal year, or until the neighborhood council program is initiated. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered, and Council members were asked to suggest members for the committee.

2. Mayor Hupp passed out copies of memorandum to Council urging the neighborhood council program be started.

3. Council has received copies of letter from Tri-Met re bus shelters, and Tri-Met's correspondence with members of Milwaukie Suburban Transit Station Citizens Contact Committee. Also received are copies of correspondence on a proposed change in route for the Ardenwald Line

4. Council has received copy of letter from McGinnis Engineering, Inc., dated March 24, regarding Council Chamber air-conditioning. It was agreed the Manager will meet with an architect and bring plans and estimates to Council.

5. Council has received copy of letter from Riverfront Development Committee, dated April 18, 1975, requesting funding to cover costs of professional consultation. The letter will be referred to the Budget Committee.

STREET RENAMING, ORDINANCE NUMBER 1308

Rebecca Yasenchak, 11926 Lamplighter, presented a petition signed by residents on Lamplighter Street, asking that the street name be retained. It was MOVED by Swan, SECONDED by Burgess, that Lamplighter Street remain Lamplighter Street, due to the fact that all of the people on the street would like it that way, and we have already opened a can of worms by leaving Wood, Stanley, Home and Beckman as they are; it doesn't appear that it will be a very long street; and that the 5400 block be indicated at the top of the sign. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. Another change has been requested by staff, when it was discovered that Lincoln Street, which is an extension of Home Avenue, had been left on the Exhibit A attached to Ordinance 1306, as being changed to 50th Avenue. Staff requests that Lincoln Street be changed to Home Avenue. It was MOVED by Hutchison, SECONDED by Burgess, that Ordinance Number 1308 (AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1308, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR RENAMING OF CERTAIN STREETS AND FOR RENUMBERING CERTAIN HOUSES IN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON) be read the first time. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Hutchison, that Ordinance 1308 be read the second time. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. Ordinance 1308 was put on its passage with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Englund, Swan, Burgess, Hutchison and Hupp. NOES: None. Ordinance 1308 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

PUBLIC HEARING - HOLLYBERRY SUBDIVISION APPEAL

Appeal has been filed against preliminary plat approval by the Planning Commission of the Hollyberry Subdivision. Attorneys for the developer and the appellants advised Council that they have entered into a stipulation. Attorney for the appellants formally withdrew the appeal.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1309 - AMENDING MOTORCYCLE ORDINANCE

It was MOVED by Hutchison, SECONDED by Burgess, that Ordinance Number 1309 (AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1307, RELATING TO THE REGULATION OF OPERATING MOTORCYCLES AND MOTOR-DRIVEN VEHICLES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY) be read the first time. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Swan, that Ordinance 1309 be read the second time. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. Ordinance 1309 was put on its passage with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Englund, Swan, Burgess, Hutchison and Hupp. NOES: None. Ordinance 1309 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

RESCISSION OF CIVIL SERVICE ORDINANCE - ORDINANCE NUMBER 1305

It was MOVED by Hutchison, SECONDED by Burgess, that Ordinance Number 1305 be rescinded. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 10-1975 - SIGNS IN PUBLIC RIGHT -OF-WAY

It was MOVED by Hutchison, SECONDED by Burgess, that Resolution Number 10-1975 (A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR COUNCIL POLICY ON THE CONSIDERATION OF REQUESTS FOR SIGNS IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY) be read. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Hutchison, that Resolution 10-1975 be adopted. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

REQUESTS FOR SIGNS IN RIGHT-OF-WAY

1. Council has received request from Linwood Alliance Church, dated February 26, 1975, for a sign at the intersection of Railroad Avenue at Stanley Avenue. It was MOVED by Englund, SECONDED by Swan, that Council accept the request with the following provisions: that the letters be no more than 4" high, or the height of the Convalescent Hospital letters, whichever is the least; that the sign be no more than 10" in height, and the length, color and design the same as the Convalescent Hospital sign. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.
2. Council has received request from Dwyer Hospital, dated April 4, 1975, for a sign on Harrison. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Hutchison, that the Council approve the service sign indicating "Hospital" for the intersections requested by Dwyer Hospital. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.
3. Council has received request from Tri-Met, dated April 4, 1975, to install a Park and Ride sign in the right-of-way at 2416 Lake Road. It was MOVED by Swan, SECONDED by Hutchison, that a sign be constructed in compliance with other standard signs, with copy to be determined by staff. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1310 - SIGN ORDINANCE

It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Hutchison, that Ordinance Number 1310 (AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CONSTRUCTION... OF SIGNS OUTSIDE THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF -WAY...) be read the second time. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

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Ordinance 1310 was put on its passage with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Englund, Swan, Burgess, Hutchison and Hupp. NOES: None. Ordinance 1310 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

CLACKAMAS WATER DISTRICT WATER SALES AGREEMENT

Council has received copy of letter from Clackamas Water District, dated April 3, 1975, enclosing copy of revised water sales agreement. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Swan, that this matter be tabled for later staff recommendation. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 11-1975 - TRANSFER OF FUNDS

It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Swan, that Resolution Number 11-1975 (A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS TO REAPPORTION THE 1974-75 BUDGET) be read. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Swan, that Resolution 11-1975 be adopted. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. Staff was asked to explain why the Fire Department sick leave line item is overexpended, and what the absentee rate is in the Fire Department.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 12-1975 - SUPPLEMENTAL GENERAL FUND BUDGET

It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Hutchison, that Resolution Number 12-1975 (RESOLUTION ADOPTING 1974-75 SUPPLEMENTAL GENERAL FUND BUDGET AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS) be read. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Swan, that Resolution 12-1975 be adopted. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

OTHER BUSINESS

1. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Englund, that liquor license renewal application be approved for Price-Rite Grocery, 1113 Main Street. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.
2. Council has received copy of letter from State Highway Division, dated April 17, with notice of public hearing on the revised Greenway Plan on April 29, 1975.
3. Council has received copy of letter from The Review, dated April 14, asking for permission to continue placement of the Review street sales stands on the public right-of-way. Staff was asked to give interim authorization to the locations that exist until a policy is established, and staff will check other cities, the League of Oregon Cities, and ask for input from the newspapers, and come back with a recommendation.

It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Swan, that the bills listed for April 22, 1975 payment be approved for payment. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.
