1231st Meeting

The one thousand two hundred thirty-first meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 4th day of November, 1974. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Donald W. Graf, with the following councilpersons present:

The invocation was given by the Reverend Wayne Allen, and the pledge of allegiance was recited.

CONSENT CALENDAR

It was MOVED by Stochosky, SECONDED by Keller, that the Consent Calendar be accepted. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

- b) Council has received letter from Nancy Stochosky, thanking Council and staff for the flowers sent during her recent hospital stay.
- c) Council has received memorandum from Public Works Director, dated October 29, recommending partial payment of \$67,514.32 to Esta, Inc., for job marked No. 2-- Fieldcrest-Mason Lane area sanitary sewers.
- d) Council has received copy of letter to Fire Department, dated October 23, thanking Chief Al Jones for visiting St. Johns School.
- e) Satisfaction of judgment has been filed in the case of Marvin F. Lines vs. City of Milwaukie.

CORRESPONDENCE

Letter has been received, dated October 22, from Security Bank of Oregon, asking permission to put up a sign in the public right-of-way at Lava Drive and River Road, advertising Shoreside East condominiums. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Keller, that the Council request staff to research the legality of placing a temporary sandwich board in an appropriate location to aid the realtor in his marketing of Shoreside East. It was MOVED by Keller, SECONDED by Stochosky, to amend the motion by striking the word "legality" and substituting the word "appropriateness." On the amendment, MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. On the main motion, as amended, MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

MEMORANDUM FROM COUNCILMAN HUPP RE GAMBELL CASE

Council has received memorandum from Councilman Hupp, dated October 28, stating he would not discuss or vote on the Gambell zone change application at the hearing on December 3, in view of Mrs. Gambell's attorney's affidavit of prejudice.

REFUSE COLLECTION RATES - RESOLUTION NUMBER 29-1974

Council has received staff report on refuse collection rates, with exhibits. It was MOVED by Keller, SECONDED by Burgess, that Resolution Number 29-1974 (A RESOLUTION SETTING RATES TO BE CHARGED BY FRANCHISEES UNDER ORDINANCE NUMBER 1301, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT, MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF A SYSTEM OF WASTE AND SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL) be read. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. It was MOVED by Burgess, SECONDED by Keller, that Resolution 29-1974 be adopted. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

(Meeting recessed at 8:20 p. m. , reconvened at 8:30 p. m. with all present.)

STAFF REPORT ON WATER SERVICE REQUEST

At the September 16 meeting Council considered a letter from Culver Construction Co. re water supply. Council has now received memorandum from Public Works Director, dated November 1, recommending condemnation of the property involved, in view of the city's need for a looped water system into Island Station. It was MOVED by Keller, SECONDED by Burgess, that the City Attorney be instructed to write Walter Nutting, owner of the property in question, requesting that he negotiate an easement, and if negotiations can't be well under way in a satisfactory manner within 45 days, that condemnation proceedings be started. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered.

STAFF REPORT ON DRAINAGE PROBLEM

At the October 21 meeting, Marlene Brandt, 9506 Winsor Drive, described a drainage problem at that address. City Manager stated he had not had an opportunity to view the problem area, and the matter was tabled until the next regular meeting.

REPORT ON FURNBERG PARK FUNDING

City Manager has contacted the State Highway Division, to see if any money might be available from their special projects fund for Furnberg Park, but was told this money was only for acquisition of new land, or completion of projects where previous commitments had been honored. Since Phase I of Furnberg Park has not been completed, no money would be available until this is done.

LABOR RELATIONS

It was MOVED by Keller, SECONDED by Burgess, that the Mayor be authorized to sign the addendum to the 1974-75 contract with Milwaukie Employees Association, which addendum covers the Public Works Field employees. MOTION CARRIED and so ordered. Claim has been made by a Police Officer who is resigning, for payment of accrued sick leave. City Manager explained that reference is made in the 1973-74 police contract to an existing benefit for payment of sick leave upon termination, but that no such benefit is spelled out in any prior contract. It was the consensus of the Council that no agreement was ever made for such a benefit for the Police Department.

OTHER BUSINESS

1. Receipt of 701 grant application has been acknowledged, and the city may appear during the processing.
2. Council has received copy of memorandum from Public Works Director re Johnson Creek drainage meetings, as well as meeting minutes from CRAG.


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3. Notice of CRAG meeting cancellation on November 7 has been received.

It was **MOVED** by Stochosky, **SECONDED** by Keller, that the bills listed for November 5, 1974 payment be approved for payment. **MOTION CARRIED** and so ordered.
