It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Fuller, that the Consent Calendar be approved. Motion carried and so ordered.

The letter from Department of Environmental Quality, dated March 7, 1972, addressed to Donald H. Peterson, of the Sewage Treatment Plant, gives recommendations for the maximum concentrations of industrial discharges into the sewage system.

- 1. Joy Burgess, Chairman of the Milwaukie Parks and Beautification Committee, asked the Council, in view of the concern of residents adjacent to Spring Creek Park, to authorize "No Trespassing" signs posted at the borders of the park. The City Attorney stated there was a legal problem with the city posting signs on private property, and Mrs. Burgess was requested to work with the owners of the private property to solve the problem.
- 2. George Hasandras, of the First State Bank, presented the city with a check for \$100 from First State Bank, in support of the activities of Milwaukie Festival Daze.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1255 - REGULATION OF DETECTIVE AGENCIES

It was moved by Fuller, seconded by Martin, that Ordinance Number 1255 (AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LICENSING OF PRIVATE INVESTIGATORS, INVESTIGATION AGENCY, DETECTIVE AGENCY, OR PROFESSIONAL INVESTIGATOR, OR ANY TITLE INDICATING THE APPLICANT IS AN INVESTIGATION AGENCY) be read the first time. Motion carried and so ordered. It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Fuller, that Ordinance 1255 be read the second time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance 1255 was put on its passage with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Hupp, Stochosky, Fuller, Martin and Graf. NOES: None. Ordinance 1255 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1256 - AMENDING ORDINANCE 1021

It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Hupp, that Ordinance Number 1256 (AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1021 BY ADDING TO AND MAKING A PART OF SECTION ONE, ORS 483.999) be read the first time. Motion carried and so ordered. It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Martin, that Ordinance 1256 be read the second time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance 1256 was put on its passage with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Hupp, Stochosky, Fuller, Martin and Graf. NOES: None. Ordinance 1256 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

ORDINANCE RELATING TO ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR

It was moved by Fuller, seconded by Martin, that (AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR, AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1024, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY) be read the first time. Motion carried and so ordered. It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Stochosky, to table this ordinance until it can be rewritten. Motion carried and so ordered.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1257 - DEFINING OFFENSES

It was moved by Fuller, seconded by Martin, that Ordinance Number 1257 (AN ORDINANCE DEFINING OFFENSES, PRESCRIBING PENALTIES, REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 1025, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY) be read the first time. Motion carried and so ordered.

(Meeting recessed at 9:30 p. m. , reconvened at 9:40 p. m. with all present.)

It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Fuller, that Section 25 of the ordinance be removed from consideration at this meeting. Motion failed to pass.

It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Fuller, that Ordinance 1257 be read the second time by title only. With the consent of the second, the maker of the motion withdrew the motion for purposes of further discussion of the ordinance. It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Martin, that Ordinance 1257 be read the second time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance 1257 was put on its passage with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Stochosky, Fuller, Martin and Graf.

NOES: Hupp. Ordinance 1257 passed the Council, and was so declared by the Mayor.

PROCLAMATION RE SPRING CLEAN-UP, FIX-UP, PAINT-UP TIME

The Mayor read a proclamation designating April 1 to June 30, 1972 as Spring Clean-up, Fix-up, Paint-up Time.
