Wednesday, June 26, 1974

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners on the date set above at which time were present Chairman Chas D. Bailey and Commissioners R. F. Brennan and F. E. Knight, the following business was transacted.

Meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 10:15.

Order and quitclaim were signed in the matter of clearing title to South half of Southwest quarter of Section 22, Township 2 South, Range 9 West, W.M.

Order and Findings of Fact was signed in the matter of exchange of property with Oregon-Idaho Conference of United Methodist Church. Quitclaims were also executed by the County.

PB liquor license application was approved for James R. Fox and Laura J. Fox, Leta & Eltons Grocery, Beaver.

Bids were opened at 1:30 for construction of the Sollie Smith Bridge. Ross Brothers Construction of Salem submitted the low bid of \$177,542 and the contract was awarded to them. Brennan moved, Knight 2nd

Bids were also submitted by Hamilton Construction \$190,905; Hannan Brothers Construction \$229,002; Coast Marine \$249,365; Gale M. Robert Co. \$201,233.

At 2 p.m. Ed Ridderbusch Insurance and Ackley Insurance submitted bids for the county comprehensive liability for Tillamook County per specifications provided by the agent of record. Ridderbusch submitted the low bid of \$12,284. Ackley bid \$15,500. Mr. Knight moved that the low bid be accepted. Seconded by Mr. Brennan and carried.

From ten thirty till noon, Pacific Northwest Bell explained a proposal to upgrade telephone communication system in the courthouse, to the commissioners, other county officers and department heads.
