1133rd Meeting

The one- thousand one-hundred thirty-third meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon was held on the 14th day of September, 1970. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Donald W. Graf. Councilmen present were:

A motion was made by Bill Hupp and seconded by Mr. Bonner to read the Resolution 27-1970 (*A RESOLUTION DECLARING INTENT TO WITHDRAW FROM CLACKAMAS WATER DISTRICT THAT PART OF SAID DISTRICT HERETOFORE ANNEXED TO AND INCORPORATED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON*). Motion carried and

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so ordered. After reading, it was moved by Hupp, seconded by Fuller, that Resolution 27-1970 be adopted. Motion carried and so ordered.

LIQUOR LICENSE REQUEST

F & M Enterprises, 720 Main Street. It was moved by Fuller, seconded by Hupp, that the Council recommend granting a Class A (beer and wine) License to F & M Enterprises at 720 Main Street.

OTHER BUSINESS

Walter Janssen reported that a fund drive is in progress to aid in financing the newly organized Citizens Radio Monitoring System.

Paul Helton requested Council consideration on October 12 agenda of a Charter revision which would remove department heads from Civil Service Status.

Staff was requested to prepare an ordinance regarding the disposition of confiscated goods for Council consideration at the next regular meeting.

Staff was requested to check with State Highway Department regarding a sign on McLoughlin Blvd. prohibiting use of "jake brakes" within city limits.

It was moved by Fuller, seconded by Hupp, that bills listed for payment on September 15, 1970 be approved for payment. Motion carried and so ordered.
