Letter from Councilman Martin to the City Manager was read, suggesting the possibility of a wine festival in the City of Milwaukie.

### PUBLIC HEARING - RAILROAD AVENUE STREET VACATION - ORDINANCE NUMBER 1252

Public hearing was declared open at 8:30 p. m. Notices published and posted as required. No one appeared to speak either in favor or against the vacation, and no correspondence was received. Public hearing was declared closed.

It was moved by Fuller, seconded by Martin, that Ordinance Number 1252 (AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF RAILROAD AVENUE, A PUBLIC STREET WITHIN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY) be read the first time. Motion carried and so ordered. It was moved by Martin, seconded by Stochosky, that Ordinance 1252 be read the second time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance 1252 was put on its passage with the following roll-call vote: AYES: Hupp, Stochosky, Fuller, Martin and Mayor Graf. NOES: None. Ordinance 1252 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

### NATIONAL BIBLE WEEK PROCLAMATION

The Mayor read proclamation making November 21-28, 1971, National Bible Week in the City of Milwaukie.

### RESOLUTION RE TRANSFER OF FUNDS

It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Martin, that the resolution be tabled until the Council knows the actual amounts involved. Motion carried and so ordered.

### RESOLUTION NUMBER 32-1971 - AGREEMENT WITH CRAG

It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Martin, that Resolution Number 32-1971 (A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SIGNATURE OF AGREEMENT DESIGNATING CRAG AS AGENT TO ESTABLISH A FEDERAL AID URBAN SYSTEM) be read. Motion carried and so ordered. It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Martin, that Resolution 32-1971 be adopted. Motion carried and so ordered.

### OTHER BUSINESS

1. Application for business license has been received from H & R Racing Enterprises at 2400 Moores Street. Staff report was read from Fire Marshal stating the building does not meet the city's requirements on building and fire safety. It was moved by Fuller, seconded by Martin, that the Council accept the City Manager's recommendation that the business license be held up until compliance with the pertinent codes. Motion carried and so ordered.

2. Petition has been received signed by six persons living on 37th Street, asking that an L.I.D. be established. A resolution will be prepared setting a hearing date.

Petition has been received from the same persons, asking to have potholes in the street filled. The City Attorney was asked for an opinion as to just what constitutes a city street, as the question was raised as to whether state tax street funds could be used if the street does not meet the requirements established by the State Constitution.

PAYMENT OF BILLS

It was moved by Stochosky, seconded by Martin, that the bills listed for November 9, 1971 payment be approved for payment. Motion carried and so ordered.
