

BUSINESS LICENSE INCREASE, ORDINANCE NO. 1211, and RESOLUTION

Ordinance No. 1211 (AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND LICENSING BUSINESSES, PROFESSIONS, PURSUITS AND OCCUPATIONS IN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, AMENDING SECTIONS 1, 2, 5, and 9 OF ORDINANCE NO. 489, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY) was read the second time. After reading, Ordinance 1211 was put on its passage with a unanimous roll call vote. Ordinance 1211 passed the Council, and was so declared by the Mayor.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 30-1969

Resolution Number 30-1969 (A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NUMBER 65-1968, AND ESTABLISHING CALENDAR YEAR LICENSE FEES) was read. It was moved by Harlan, seconded by Hupp, that Resolution 30-1969 be adopted. Motion carried and so ordered.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 28-1969

It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Harlan, that Resolution Number 28-1969 (A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON TO CONSTRUCT SANITARY SEWERS ON BECKMAN ROAD AND WOOD AVENUE) be read. Motion carried and so ordered. After reading, it was moved by Strauss, seconded by Harlan, that Resolution 28-1969 be adopted. Motion carried and so ordered. The date for remonstrance hearing is January 12, 1970.

It was moved by Harlan, seconded by Graf, that January 12, 1970 be set as the date for bid opening for said sewer construction. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Graf, seconded by Harlan, that based on acceptance after public hearing on January 12, 1970, of construction of sanitary sewers on Beckman Road and Wood Avenue, the City Manager be authorized to enter into an agreement with Kenneth Waymire for the pumping station at Lamplighter Street and Railroad Avenue. Motion carried and so ordered.

PUBLIC HEARING - ACCEPTANCE & ASSESSMENT OF STREET IMPROVEMENTS FOR 30th AVENUE

Hearing was opened at 8:30 p.m. with notices posted and published as required. There were no remonstrances and the hearing was declared closed.

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Recess was declared at 8:35 and meeting reconvened at 8:45 with all Councilmen present.

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SALARY AND CLASSIFICATION SURVEY

The City Manager was asked to request three local business personnel executives to meet with the City Council at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 16, for further study of salary survey. A Council work session to consider City Manager applications will follow the meeting.

TRUCK TRAFFIC ON KING ROAD

It was moved by Hupp, seconded by Graf, that a resolution be drawn designating King Road west of 42nd Street as closed to all through truck traffic. Motion carried and so ordered.

RECOMMENDATION FROM PLANNING COMMISSION ON ZONE CHANGE REQUEST

It was moved by Graf, seconded by Harlan, to concur with the Planning Commission recommendation and to deny the zone change ZC-69-7, a request to change from R-7 single-family to A-2 multi-family residential for property located at 4444 Johnson Creek Blvd. (TL 44, 45, and 46, Geo. Wills DLC). Motion carried and so ordered.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1212 - STREET IMPROVEMENT ASSESSMENT OF 30th AVENUE

It was moved by Harlan, seconded by Graf, for the first reading of Ordinance Number 1212 (AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE ASSESSMENT FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 30th AVENUE BETWEEN VAN WATER AND ROSWELL STREETS BY CONSTRUCTION OF AN ADEQUATE STREET AND ALL OTHER THINGS APPURTENANT TO STREET CONSTRUCTION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY). Motion carried. After reading, it was moved by Harlan, seconded by Graf, that Ordinance Number 1212 be read the second time by title only. After reading, Ordinance 1212 was put on its passage with a unanimous roll call vote. Ordinance 1212 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWALS

American Legion Club, 1316 Main Street. It was moved by Strauss, seconded by Hupp, that the Council recommend renewal of the DCA license. Motion carried and so ordered.

Keith's Market, 2936 Washington Street. It was moved by Graf, seconded by Hupp, that the Council recommend renewal of the PB license. Motion carried and so ordered.

Price-Rite Grocery, 1115 Main Street. It was moved by Harlan, seconded by Graf, that the Council recommend renewal of the PB license. Motion carried and so ordered.

OTHER BUSINESS

1. It was announced by the City Manager that Mrs. June Routson has resigned as Chairman of the Parks & Beautification Committee. It was moved by Graf, seconded by Strauss, that a letter of appreciation for the many hours of devoted service to the City be sent to Mrs. Routson. Motion carried and so ordered.

2. Councilman Strauss, reporting on a meeting of subcommittee chairmen of the Downtown Improvement Committee, announced that the general public is invited to a meeting to be held in the Council Chambers on Thursday, January 22, 1970 at 7:30 p.m. to see sketches and to discuss projected ideas for downtown improvement.

3. *Councilman Hupp brought up* ~~There was~~ discussion of noise abatement from compression brakes used on trucks. City Manager was asked to try to get copies of ordinances passed in other cities to regulate use of the brakes within their city limits, and try to get an opinion from the trucking industry to find whether there would be a safety factor involved in regulating such brake usage.


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PAYMENT OF BILLS
