

## MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF MARCH 9, 1964

COUNCIL CHAMBER

992ND MEETING

The nine hundred ninety-second regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held at the City Hall in Milwaukie, Oregon, on the ninth day of March, 1964, commencing at the hour of 7:30 p.m. Pacific Standard Time.

The meeting was duly called to order by Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., Chairman of the Council.

The roll was called by Clerk Ellen Martin. Those present were: Mayor Joseph M. Bernard Jr.; Councilmen Charles Renard, Walter J. Freeman, Theron E. Sedgwick and Robert E. Richmond, being all of the members of the City Council.

Also present at the meeting were: City Manager Max Thompson; City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Council Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council, held on the 10th day of February, 1964, were approved as read.

The minutes of the special meeting of the City Council, held on the 24th day of February, 1964, were approved as read.

The invocation was given at the hour of 7:30 P.M. by Reverend Ben Harris, Assembly of God Church, 10680 Grant Street.

Mrs. P. V. Marker, 3832 Jefferson Street, came before the Council and explained that, under permit, they had moved a house on to their property, Lots 7, 8, 9, 10, Block 71, Minthorn Addition. Their intention was to remodel the house to be occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Marker. The house was set in front of the house they were occupying which had been built on the back of the property long before zoning was in effect in Milwaukie. The Markers now want to remodel the small house and use it as rental unit, and asked if it would be necessary to join it to the larger house, making a duplex, before she could rent it to tenants. Mrs. Marker was advised to take this matter before the Planning Commission at their meeting on March 17.

A letter from Standard Oil Co. was read, the letter was a request that they be permitted to have one 30 foot driveway opening into Lake Road and two 30 foot driveways opening into 21st Street from a filling station which they propose to build at the southeast corner of Block 40 at 21st and Lake Road. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Renard that this matter be referred to the Planning Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Boyd Jossy reported that he and the contractor had gone over the plans for the library and had brought the actual construction cost down to \$136,000.00 and that he would present the proposed plans to the Library Board for their approval.

The Citizen's Fire Committee's report was again taken up and examined. Fire Chief Wickam and Manager Thompson explained the different items recommended by the Committee. Manager Thompson stated that the new equipment items, which were much needed were too large to be financed by the budget and recommended that the City have a Bond election to raise \$150,000.00 to be paid in fifteen years. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that the following Resolution be adopted.

Resolution No. 8-1964, providing for the calling of a Special Election to vote on a proposed Amendment to the City Charter authorizing the City to issue General Obligation Bonds in the sum of \$150,000.00, in order to provide the City with additional fire fighting facilities was then read to the City Council by City Attorney John O. Sheldahl.

It was moved by Councilman Robert E. Richmond and seconded by Councilman Theron E. Sedgwick that Resolution No. 8-1964, be adopted. The motion was put to a vote by Mayor and Chairman Joseph M. Bernard, Jr. with the following result: Ayes: Charles Renard, Walter J. Freeman, Theron E. Sedgwick, Robert E. Richmond and Joseph M. Bernard, Jr. Nays: None. Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., Mayor and Chairman, then declared that Resolution No. 8-1964 had been adopted by the unanimous vote of all of the members of the City Council.

Pursuant to the directives contained in said Resolution, the Mayor and Chairman then ordered that the original of Resolution No. 8-1964 be placed on file with the City Recorder at his office in the City Hall in Milwaukie, Oregon, at least fifteen days before April 24, 1964 and that an exact copy of said Resolution No. 8-1964 be inserted in and made a part of the minutes of this regular meeting.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 8-1964

A RESOLUTION SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AN AMENDMENT TO THE CITY CHARTER, AS AMENDED, TO BE KNOWN AS CHAPTER VIII-F, WHICH PROVIDES FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE PRESENT FIRE FIGHTING FACILITIES OF SAID CITY, WHICH PROVIDES FOR THE ACQUISITION OF NECESSARY REAL PROPERTY AND EASEMENTS IN REAL PROPERTY IN CONNECTION WITH SAID PURPOSES, WHICH PROVIDES FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF BY THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF SAID CITY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$150,000.00 WHICH SHALL BE PAID BY AN AD VALOREM TAX ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE: PROVIDING FOR THE BALLOT TITLE UNDER WHICH SAID AMENDMENT SHALL APPEAR, AND CALLING AND PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION AT WHICH SAID CHARTER AMENDMENT IS TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, is presently served with inadequate fire fighting equipment which creates grave dangers to the City and its inhabitants from the hazards of fire and consequent danger to property and to the lives of human beings; and

WHEREAS, in order to avoid the said hazards and dangers and to provide the City and its inhabitants with protection therefrom, and to promote the best interests of the City and its inhabitants, it is necessary to construct a fire drill tower, improve existing fire stations, and to provide additional fire fighting trucks and additional fire fighting equipment; and

WHEREAS, the said fire drill tower, improvements to existing fire stations, the additional fire fighting trucks and equipment now contemplated will be of benefit to the entire City of Milwaukie and its inhabitants and should be paid for by all of the taxpayers residing within said City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie desires to amend its Charter, as amended, in order that the power to acquire additional real property and easements in real property, a fire drill tower and additional fire fighting trucks and fire fighting equipment, and in order that the power to issue general obligation bonds in payment therefor and the right to levy and collect such ad valorem taxes on all of the taxable property within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the payment of principal and interest on said bonds may specifically be provided for,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that a special election be and the same is hereby called to be held in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the 24th day of April, 1964, at which time there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for adoption or rejection, a proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, as amended, which Charter was adopted on November 7, 1944, which said proposed amendment is to be a new Chapter, designated as Chapter VIII-F, and said amendment to be so submitted shall be as follows:

CHARTER AMENDMENT

PROPOSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL AND REFERRED TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF SAID CITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON:

That the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, adopted by the people of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the 7th day of November, 1944, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following Chapter:

CCB102

CHAPTER VIII-F

In addition to the other methods provided by the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, or the General Laws of the State of Oregon, and not in derogation of any such powers, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, when in its discretion it is deemed advisable, may provide by resolution or resolutions for the construction, either by contract method or city construction method, or both, of a fire drill tower and improvements to existing fire stations within the city limits of the said City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and to acquire by purchase new fire fighting trucks and other additional fire fighting equipment, together with all the appurtenances necessary for the completion and operation of said improvements, and for such purposes may acquire by gift, purchase, grant or condemnation necessary lands and easements therefor within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon; and to pay the cost thereof, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, is hereby authorized to issue \$150,000.00 in general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, which shall be paid by an ad valorem tax on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the said City of Milwaukie.

The City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, each year shall provide in the budget for sufficient funds to pay the principal and interest on said general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, which taxes shall be in addition to all other taxes permitted by the Charter, as amended, of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the laws of the State of Oregon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that it is not practicable to submit the foregoing measure or charter amendment in the form and by ballot title required by subsection (1) of Section 20 of Article V of Ordinance No. 735 of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and that, in order to truly and impartially state the purpose and the effect of the measure or charter amendment in question, it should be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, in the following form and ballot title, to-wit:

CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL AND REFERRED TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CITY CHARTER.

Shall the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon as amended, be further amended by adding thereto a Chapter to be known as Chapter VIII-F, authorizing and empowering the City Council to construct a fire drill tower and improvements to existing fire stations within said City, and to acquire by purchase new fire fighting trucks and additional fire fighting equipment; authorizing and empowering the City Council to purchase and construct all the appurtenances necessary for the completion and operation of said improvements; authorizing and empowering the City Council to acquire by gift, purchase, grant or condemnation the necessary lands and easements therefor; authorizing and empowering the City Council to issue general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, in the amount of \$150,000.00, which shall be paid by an annual ad valorem tax on all taxable property within the corporate limits of said City that is in addition to all other taxes permitted by the Charter, as amended, of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the laws of the State of Oregon; and authorizing, empowering and directing the City Council to provide each year in the budget of said City for sufficient funds to pay the principal and interest on said general obligation bonds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the election precinct for said special election shall be and constitute all of the territory within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and that there shall be one polling place for said special election, namely, in the City Hall, 926 Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon, at which polling place all legal voters shall vote, and which polling place shall be open from 8:00 o'clock a.m. to 8:00 o'clock p.m., Pacific Standard Time.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the following named persons, all legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, be and they are hereby designated and appointed as chairman and clerks of election, to act as the election board at such polling place, and on such date, to-wit:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, be and he hereby is empowered and ordered to make all other arrangements and to secure the necessary supplies for said special election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, be and he hereby is directed to give at least ten (10) days' notice of the special election hereby called by posting notices thereof in not less than three public places within the boundaries of Milwaukie, Oregon, and by publishing said notice once in the official city newspaper. The Milwaukie Review. The said notice shall be in the following form:

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

On the 24th day of April, 1964, in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, from 8:00 o'clock a.m. to 8:00 o'clock p.m., Pacific Standard Time, a special city election will be held at which a charter amendment will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for their approval or rejection.

The following is the ballot title, the number and form in which the question will be printed on the official ballot:





Mr. Gunst and Mr. Hough, owners of properties in Hector Campbell D.L.C. came before the Council and made inquiry about a proposed zone change effecting their properties. These gentlemen were referred to the Planning Commission.

Ordinance Number 1010 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Freeman that Ordinance No. 1010 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 1010 AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the construction of sanitary sewers in 28th Street and Lakeside Avenue, in Hoesley's Lakeside Addition, and a lift station, pressure line and pumping equipment, and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Freeman, Renard, Sedgwick, Richmond and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 1010 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

An application for recommendation for a Restaurant Class "A" liquor license for the Candlelight Pizza (Beverly Andreasen) was laid before the Council. A letter from Chief of Police Brittingham stating that there was no record against the Candlelight Pizza accompanied the

the application. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that a recommendation for a Restaurant Class "A" liquor license be granted to the Candlelight Pizza. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from the Planning Commission was read. In the letter the Commission recommended that the Zone for Lots 818, 22, 23, 24, Block 3, Quincy Addition, be not changed. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that the Council accept the recommendation of the Planning Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from the Planning Commission was read, in which they recommended that where streets are improved by curbs and pavement that sidewalks be required and that henceforth all new subdivisions be required to pave the streets not less than forty (40) feet in width and that monolithic sidewalks and curbs, five feet (5') in width be required on a fifty foot street. It was moved by Freeman and seconded by Sedgwick that the City Manager make a study of the latest thinking on this question in home development and report his findings at the meeting of the Planning Commission.

Ordinance No. 1011 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance No. 1011 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 1011 AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure to annex, without election, certain territory, contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for the public hearing before the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Freeman, Renard, Sedgwick, Richmond and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 1011 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 1012 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that Ordinance Number 1012 be passed to its second and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 1012 AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation, was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Freeman, Renard, Sedgwick, Richmond, and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 1012 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Mr. Carl Reinke, from Stevens and Thompson, laid before the Council, plans for the Waverly Heights sanitary sewer. It was moved by Renard and seconded by Richmond that the plans for the sanitary sewer for Waverly Heights be approved by the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Thompson reported the progress of the codifying of the City Ordinances and stated that there would be two types of bindings used on the loose leaf books and asked the Council how many they thought he should order. It was moved by Richmond and seconded by Sedgwick that the Manager be authorized to order 10 of the hard bound books and 25 of the pressed paper bound books. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Thompson reported that he had received a letter from Albertson's in which they stated as follows: "That Albertson's Inc. had deposited the following items in Escrow with the Title & Trust Co. in Oregon City.

1. Albertson's Escrow Instructions.
2. Albertson's check in the amount of \$4,400.00
3. An executed deed of Dedication wherein Albertson's Inc. conveys for street purposes the westerly twenty-eight (28) feet of certain real property owned by it in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon.
4. Original executed draft of Agreement by and between Albertson's Inc. and the City of Milwaukie wherein said City agrees to purchase and convey certain real property unto Albertson's Inc and wherein said City agrees to extend and improve both 32nd and 34th Streets in Milwaukie, Oregon, and certain other agreements.
5. Warranty Deed wherein City of Milwaukie conveys certain real properties to Albertson's Inc."

The letter, signed by Larry F. Klang, Real Property Representative for Albertson's also stated that they plan to commence construction of commercial development on their property in ninety days or less. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that the City purchase the property from Southern Pacific Railroad Co. and that the Manager be authorized to negotiate the purchase. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Thompson reported that the public drinking fountain at Main and Monroe Streets, given by the Gay Blade, had been installed.

City Attorney John O. Sheldahl, furnished each Councilman with a copy of a proposed Civil Service Ordinance for their study.

Mayor Bernard appointed Councilman Robert Richmond as Chairman of a Committee to study the matter of employment disability or retirement, and stated he would appoint other members of the Committee later.

Manager Thompson reported and explained the need for a "STOP" sign, stopping traffic entering Main Street from 99E, near Harvester Drive. It was moved by Renard and seconded by Sedgwick that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 9-1964

WHEREAS, by virtue of Ordinance Number 530 of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, the City Council is authorized to make changes in parking and traffic regulations by resolution to become effective when proper markers and signs have been installed; and

WHEREAS, traffic hazards have developed at the exit ramp leading from the east side of McLoughlin Boulevard to Main Street of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that all vehicles proceeding in an easterly direction along the exit ramp leading from McLoughlin Boulevard to Main Street of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, be required to come to a complete stop before entering said Main Street, and that a proper sign be posted at an appropriate place to indicate the required stop.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE provisions of this Resolution shall be and become effective from and after the erection of the said stop sign as hereinabove stated.
