

MEETING OF JUNE 13, 1960

947th REGULAR MEETING

The nine hundred forty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, was held on the thirteenth day of June, 1960.

The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Clay.

Present: Mayor Clay; Councilmen James Howard, Peter Mortensen, E. H. Aebi, and Theron Sedgwick; City Manager Leonard Mullan, Attorney John Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the sixth day of June, 1960, were approved as written.

Mrs. Mildred Campbell came before the Council and stated that she had not signed a bond application to bond one of her lots (Lot 19, Block 1, Appleby Acres) for the Area "B" sewer assessment. Mrs. Campbell stated that she had paid the assessment on one of her lots and had expected to receive funds with which to pay the assessment in full on the other lot, that she had not yet received the money and was worried that she would be charged the penalty for not paying or bonding, and requested that she be permitted to bond the property at this time in order to escape the penalty which is due to be added on July 25th. After discussion, the Council advised Mrs. Campbell that the Council would meet again on July 11th, and that if she had not already paid the assessment, to come before them at that time.

A petition, signed by 78 residents in the Plat of Fieldcrest, requesting that street lights be installed in Fieldcrest, was read. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Sedgwick that the City Manager make proper investigation on the matter of location etc for street lights in Fieldcrest. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Gunter, former proprietor of the Sweet Shop, came before the Council and requested a permit to operate a popcorn wagon in Milwaukie. Mr. Gunter stated that he had permission to park the wagon on the Signal Station lot at 21st and Monroe streets for the convenience of the children at the swimming pool, but would like to park on the streets near the Jr. High School and near St. John School during games at these places. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Aebi that Mr. Gunter be given a revokable permit to operate a popcorn wagon as outlined above. Motion carried and so ordered.

It being eight o'clock, the Mayor opened the hearing on the Area "D" sewers in Masonmead and Derry Acres and areas east of 41st Street, and called for objections to the same. There were many owners of property in the Plat of Fieldcrest and the unplatted area east of 41st Street and north of Fieldcrest who objected to sewers in this area. Those in Fieldcrest stated that they were not having trouble with their septic tanks and did not anticipate trouble. They strongly protested the square foot assessment for trunk line and lift station as they felt sure they would never have use for the same. The owners of unplatted properties along the east side of 41st Street had the same reasons for their objections as the Fieldcrest owners. There were a few residents of Masonmeade and Derry Acres who stated they had not been invited to sign the petition requesting the sewers and felt they should be given this right. After much discussion, the citizens from these areas suggested that petitions be circulated in the areas which would give them the opportunity to sign either for or against the improvement. The Council agreed that this be done and authorized the City Manager to furnish such petitions to those volunteers who would circulate same.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the improvement of 40th Court from Olsen Ave. south, by paving. There was objection made to assessing the properties 100 feet back from each side of the street as Lots 3,4 and 7, Block 3, Plimpton Tracts, lying within 100 feet of 40th Court but facing Olsen Avenue and 41st Street would in no way benefit from this improvement. It was agreeable to the property owners along 40th Court that the assessment district be only 50 feet back from 40th Court. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Aebi that the improvement of 40th Court by black-top pavement proceed. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Fred Schlaf, from Portland Traction Co. was present at the meeting to discuss the condition of the recently laid railroad tract in McBrod Avenue. It was shown that the track was not in conformance with the street grade. Mr. Schlaf stated that their engineer understood that the street grade was to be changed. After considerable discussion it was agreed that the City would furnish the Portland Traction Co. with the grade of the street and that the Portland Traction Company would put the tracks in to conform with the street level.

A letter from the Milwaukie Planning Commission was read. The Commission recommended that Block 2 Streib's Addition be changed from Zone 3R-1 to Commercial Zone. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Howard that the Council accept the recommendation of the Planning Commission and that the zone change be made. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 804 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Mortensen that Ordinance Number 804 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 804 AN ORDINANCE providing for the rezoning of certain property in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, from Zone 3R-1 to Commercial Zone, amending Ordinance Number 481 as amended, and declaring an emergency; was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had, Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 804 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 802 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that Ordinance Number 802 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 802 AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had; Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 802 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 803 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that Ordinance Number 803 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 803 AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure to annex, without election, certain territories, contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency; was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had; Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 803 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Aebi that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 20-1960

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE COUNTY COURT OF CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON TO SURRENDER JURISDICTION OVER STREETS LYING WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO REQUEST SUCH SURRENDER OF JURISDICTION ON BEHALF OF THE CITY COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, it has been considered and deemed necessary and expedient and for the best interests of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, acquire jurisdiction over certain streets lying within the corporate limits of said City as the same are (is) herewith described

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that by virtue of the foregoing and by virtue of the provisions of Section 373.270 Oregon Revised Statutes, that the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, do and it hereby does, request the County Court of the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon to surrender the jurisdiction over the following portions of the County Roads as the same now lie within the corporate limits of the

City of Milwaukie, Oregon, said portion of said streets being described as follows:

SHERRETT STREET from 28th Street to 29th Avenue (in the Plat of Burley Acres)
28th STREET from Clackamas County line to 21st Ave. (Van Water Street) (in the plat of Burley Acres)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, be, and he hereby is authorized and directed to request of the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon, the surrender of jurisdiction over the portions of County Roads as hereinabove described, on behalf of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan read a letter, written to Fire Chief Lillis, from the Clackamas County Civil Defense, in which Mr. Lillis was advised that Milwaukie's share in the cost of a new County Fire Base Station was the sum of \$50.00. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that the Council approve the bill and that the same be paid. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan read the work report on the Storm Sewer, from P.S. Lord Mechanical Contractors, for the month of May showing the amount now due to be \$6,303.82. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Mortensen that the Council approve the bill and that P.S. Lord Mechanical Contractors be paid \$6,303.82. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan read a letter from Robert L. Strasser, of the Strasser Drilling Co., with regard to a deep well Turbine Pump to be installed in the new deep well at Railroad Avenue. Mr. Strasser offered to pay the pump supplier for the pump and add the cost to the cost of the well, combine both amounts into a one payment contract bearing interest at 4% per annum on unpaid balances. Terms of the contract to be decided at a later date. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Aebi that the Council approve Mr. Strasser's offer. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter, from Fire Chief Lillis, in which he recommended that Assistant Chief Jerry Carpenter be authorized to attend the Oregon Fire Chief's Conference at Seaside, Oregon, June 19 to 23, and that an expense account of \$50.00 be allowed, was read. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Aebi that Assistant Fire Chief Jerry Carpenter attend the Conference and that \$50.00 expense account be allowed. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan reported that he has an estimate of cost of \$2,000.00 for the paving of a 30 feet strip of Lava Drive. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Aebi that the Manager be authorized to call for bids for this improvement. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Police Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Manager Mullan reported that trucks and other heavy traffic were damaging Washington Street from Main Street to McLoughlin Boulevard and suggested that these heavy vehicles be routed over Jefferson Street. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Howard that an Ordinance be prepared to control the weight of traffic on Washington Street between Main Street and McLoughlin Boulevard. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan read a letter from Wheelock & Richardson, Attorneys, in which they stated that their client was requesting that the penalty be excused on the assessment for sewer. It appears that the owner of Lot 9 and a part of Lot 10, Block 3, Bonnie View Acres had died without bonding for the assessment, that his heir was not aware that this matter had been neglected and was now requesting to be allowed to bond without penalty. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Mortensen that this matter be referred to the City Attorney. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan presented a list of City owned, and other properties, which had been assessed to the City for different improvements, and requested that the Recorder be permitted to write off these assessments. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Mortensen that the Recorder be permitted to write off the assessments against the following properties:
