

MEETING OF OCTOBER 9, 1961

COUNCIL CHAMBER

963rd MEETING

The nine hundred sixty third regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie, was held on the ninth day of October, 1961.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Clay.

Present: Mayor Earl Clay; Councilmen James Howard, Charles Renard, E. H. Aebi and Theron Sedgwick; City Manager Leonard Mullan, City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred sixty-second regular meeting of the Council, held on the eleventh day of September, 1961, were approved as written.

The minutes of a Special meeting of the Council, held on the fifteenth day of September, 1961, were approved as written.

Mr. Peter Mortensen came before the Council and stated that the Rod and Gun Club and the Park Commission had viewed the property along the river at the foot of Jefferson Street and that they recommended that the development work for boat landing and park should be done now while the water is at a low point. The matter was referred to the City Manager.

It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that the City pay the expenses for those City Officials who attend the League of Oregon Cities, when it convenes in Portland, opening October 15. The motion carried with one dissenting vote by Mr. Renard.

The time having arrived the Mayor opened the hearing on the assessment for the improvement of 26th Street south of Lake Road, and called for objections to the same, Mr. Davis stated that he had sold a part of his property and that his proposed assessment had been made for the whole of the property. Mr. Davis was referred to the City Recorder to have the assessment adjusted. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the withdrawal of properties annexed by Ordinance No. 854, from the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District, and called for objection to the same. There was no verbal objection from any person present and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Ordinance Number 856 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that Ordinance No. 856 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 856 AN ORDINANCE withdrawing from the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District, Clackamas County, Oregon, those parts of said district heretofore annexed to and incorporated within the boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes; Howard Renard, Aebi, Sedgwick and Clay. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 856 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Mr. Fred Weber came before the Council and made inquiry with regard to sewer and water right-of-way and a public roadway from Johnson Creek Boulevard southeasterly to a proposed road in the Weber Tract known as Tarrybrook. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Renard that Attorney Sheldahl be authorized to proceed with investigation of this matter and that the following Resolution be adopted.

As regards as per Mr. Sheldahl

The Mayor opened the hearing on the annexation of properties described in Ordinance No. 952 and called for any objection to the same. It was shown that proper notices of the hearing had been published and posted. There was no registered voter or any other person present who made objection and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Ordinance Number 857 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that Ordinance Number 857 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 857 AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation, and declaring an emergency, was taken again up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Howard, Renard, Aebi, Sedgwick and Clay. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 857 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that the following three Resolutions be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 26-1961

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie, by appropriate statutory procedure, has heretofore annexed the following described tracts of real property bounded as follows:

All that portion of Tax Lot 64 lying easterly of Johnson Creek Boulevard in the Geo. Wills D.L.C. 42, in Section 30, T. 1 S., R. 2 E., of W.M. in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, bounded as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the north boundary line of Clackamas County and the easterly boundary line of Johnson Creek Boulevard and the southwesterly right-of-way boundary of the Portland Traction Company; thence southwesterly right-of-way line of said Portland Traction Company a distance of approximately 180 feet; thence southwesterly a distance of 100 feet, more or less, to a point in the east shore of Johnson Creek; thence following the east shore line of said creek southeasterly a distance of approximately 225 feet; thence west parallel with the north boundary line of Clackamas County, to the east boundary of Johnson Creek Boulevard; thence northeasterly along the northeast boundary line of Johnson Creek Boulevard to the point of beginning.

AND WHEREAS, the above described real properties lie within the boundaries of the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District a Fire Protection district in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Oregon.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that it does hereby elect to cause the withdrawal from the said MILWAUKIE RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, all that part of said DISTRICT hereinabove lying within the boundary hereinabove described and heretofore incorporated in and annexed to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.



Ordinance Number 861, AN ORDINANCE providing for procedure, without election, to annex certain territory contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 511, Oregon Laws, 1961, accepting written consents of landowners in such territory to said annexation; determining that at least two-thirds of said consenting land owners also own at least two-thirds of the land in said contiguous territory and own real property therein representing at least two-thirds of the assessed value of the real property in the said contiguous territory; fixing a day for a public hearing before the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation; directing publication and posting of notice of such hearing; and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Howard, Renard, Aebi, Sedgwick and Clay. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 861 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 862 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Renard and seconded by Aebi that Ordinance Number 862 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 862 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDIING FOR PROCEDURE, without election, to annex certain territory, contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 511 Oregon Laws, 1961; accepting written consents of landowners in such territory to said annexation; determining that at least two-thirds of said consenting landowners also own at least two-thirds of the land in said contiguous territory and own real property therein representing at least two-thirds of the assessed value of the real property in the said contiguous territory; fixing a day for a public hearing before the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication and posting of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Howard, Renard, Aebi, Sedgwick and Clay. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 862 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 863 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that Ordinance Number 863 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 863 AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the improvement of 4th Street by asphaltic pavement, from 50 feet east of its intersection with 7th Avenue easterly a distance of approximately 234 feet, and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Howard, Renard, Aebi, Sedgwick, and Clay. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 863 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A letter, requesting that Second Street be vacated from Third Avenue to the Willamette River was read. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that the request be rejected. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan read Stevens & Thompson's progress report on the Area "D" sewers which showed the amount now owing Contractor Robertson to be \$9,172.80 less 10%. Inasmuch as the Engineers had not yet accepted the work it was decided that the amount be not paid until the Engineers accepted the work.

Manager Mullan reported that new signal lights had been installed at the Main line Railroad crossing on Harrison Street.

A letter, from Harold Juedes, was read. Mr. Juedes stated that on October 26, 1961 he had narrowly escaped a serious accident at the Monroe Street of the Southern Pacific Railroad Tillamook Branch crossing and suggested that the City require the Southern Pacific Company to do the following things in order that this crossing would be less dangerous for vehicular traffic.

1. Remove the pile of dirt so that it will not obstruct the view.
 2. Have weeds cleared from above right-of-way
 3. Have branches of trees trimmed away along Monroe Street on north.
 4. Have railroad sign on south side of Monroe painted so that it can be seen from a distance.
 5. Install a stop sign, similar to the ones that are now placed in various spots in the City, to right on Monroe Street so that all vehicles coming from east and going west will be forced to stop.
- It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Aebi that the City Manager write to the Southern Pacific Company and request that they do the things as listed in Mr. Juedes' letter. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan read a letter from John Borden, Public Health Sanitarian for Clackamas County, in which he stated that an inspection had been made of the Ledding estate property along the west side of Main Street from Jackson Street to Monroe Street and reported the following conditions in the buildings.

1. Highly inadequate toilet facilities in all cases; inadequate plumbing, not in conformity with State Plumbing Code and insanitary room area.
2. The outside structure in all cases is old and ridden with dry rot. Also, there is very strong evidence of rodent infestation which is impossible to control due to the condition of the buildings.

"There were leaks in the roof everywhere and portions of the floor were completely gone, in some instances.

The businesses involved have each built a sort of inner shell within the main structure, although this does not eradicate the problem of age and disrepair surrounding such inner structure."

Manager Mullan was requested to write to the executor of the Ledding estate demanding that action be taken to correct this condition.

The Police Chief's report was read and ordered filed.

Manager Mullan laid before the Council, a letter from the First National Bank of Oregon, 6th and Morrison Branch, under the date of October 25, 1961, in which they stated they were returning two certified copies of letters addressed to Leroy J. and Margaret L. Morby, in care of the (1st National Bank of Oregon) The Bank informed the City that the Morbys were now living in California. The registered letters sent to the Morbys, c/o the Bank were the two notices of assessment for the Area "C" Ardenwald sewer. The letter advising them of the hearing date for the assessment was mailed July 17, 1961. The letter advising them of the assessment and bonding date had been mailed August 24, 1961. This letter advised them their assessment must be paid or bonded on or before September 20, 1961, it also advised them that if no action was taken to pay or bond within 90 days, a penalty of 10% would be added to the assessment. The only address for the Morbys, available to the City Recorder was c/o 1st National Bank. Inasmuch, as, through neglect on the part of the bank, the Morbys did not receive any notice of the assessment, they were, through their agent, Burt Realty Co. inquiring as to what they could do to secure the property. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Howard that inasmuch as Mr. and Mrs. Morby were not aware of the assessment at the time it was made, that they be allowed to bond the South $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 5, Block 2, Appleby Acres, in the amount of \$368.68 and that the City Recorder be authorized to date the bond as of September 20, 1961. The motion carried and was so ordered.

Manager Mullan showed plans for the equipment shed to be built at 40th and Harvey Streets. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that Manager Mullan be authorized to proceed with the construction of the building and call for bids for the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mayor Clay reported that on October 18, 1961, he had made the following Proclamation.

Nays: None. Ordinance Number 858 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 859 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that Ordinance No. 859 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

ORDINANCE Number 859 AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the improvement of 26th Street by curbs along both sides thereof, from a point where Geno Street intersects 26th Street, southeasterly a distance of approximately 153 feet, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Howard, Renard, Aebi, Sedgwick and Clay. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 859 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

An application for renewal of recommendation for a Package Store "P.B." liquor license for Bernice M. Scott for a Grocery store at 2936 Washington Street, was laid before the Council. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Aebi that the recommendation be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan reported that the City's share of the cost of installing new traffic lights on McLoughlin Boulevard, including the removal of the present traffic light at Monroe Street would be \$8500.00 It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that the Manager be authorized to proceed with the installation of traffic lighting on McLoughlin Blvd. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Renard and seconded by Sedgwick that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 29-1961

RESOLUTION RELATING TO PARKING ALONG THE NORTH SIDE OF MONROE STREET FROM MAIN STREET TO MCLOUGHLIN BOULEVARD BETWEEN THE HOURS OF FOUR O'CLOCK P.M. AND SIX O'CLOCK P.M.

WHEREAS, by virtue of Ordinance No. 530 of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, the City Council is authorized to make changes in traffic regulations by resolution to become effective when the proper signs have been installed; and

WHEREAS, a traffic hazard and traffic congestion has developed on Monroe Street between Main Street and McLoughlin Boulevard in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, between the hours of four o'clock p.m. and six o'clock p.m.; and

WHEREAS, it is now deemed necessary and expedient to make the following change in the parking regulations covering the use of the north side of Monroe Street between the said Main Street and McLoughlin Boulevard, and to install and locate signs regulating such use; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the parking of motor vehicles or vehicles of any kind or description be and the same is hereby prohibited along the north side of Monroe Street in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, between the intersection of said Monroe Street with Main Street and McLoughlin Boulevard within said City between the hours of four o'clock p.m., and six o'clock p.m. of each day.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE City Manager of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, be and he hereby is authorized and directed to cause proper signs to be so placed as to indicate the prohibition against parking as required by this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the provisions of this Resolution shall be and become effective from and after the erection of the signs herein provided for.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 30-1961

RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE MINIMUM WIDTH OF ROAD BED REQUIRED IN STREETS HEREINAFTER CONSTRUCTED WITHIN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON

Whereas, increased traffic and the increased need for fire protection within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, will require the use of wider road beds in all streets hereinafter to be constructed within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that from and after the passage of this Resolution no street construction within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, shall be undertaken or approved by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, unless the plans for such street construction call for a road bed (space between curbs or curb lines) of not less than 32 feet in width.




