

SPECIAL MEETING OF MARCH 7, 1958

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the seventh day of March, 1958, for the purpose of a hearing on the withdrawal of certain territories, recently annexed to the City of Milwaukie, from the Oak Lodge Sanitary District, the vacation of an alley in Tract 1, Milwaukie Industrial Park, the hearing on the extension of Lake Road Sewer and 37th Street sewer and such other matters necessary to come before the Council at this time.

## SPECIAL MEETING OF MARCH 7, 1958 continued

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick and Attorney Sheldahl. Absent: Clerk Martin.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the withdrawal of certain territories recently annexed to the City which lie within the boundaries of the Oak Lodge Sanitary District, and called for objections to the withdrawal of the properties, as listed in the published and posted notices, from the district. There was no citizen present who made protest or objection.

Ordinance Number 705 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Roberts that Ordinance Number 705 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 705 AN ORDINANCE withdrawing from Oak Lodge Sanitary District, Clackamas County, Oregon, those parts of said District heretofore annexed to and incorporated within the boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Roberts, Klein, Clay, Moetensen and Mullan. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 705 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the matter of the vacation of an alley in Tract 1, Milwaukie Industrial Park and called for objections to the vacation of the alley as described in the published and posted notices. There was no citizen present who protested the vacation of the alley. Ordinance Number 706 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Mortensen that Ordinance Number 706 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 706 AN ORDINANCE vacating an alley in Tract 1, Milwaukie Industrial Park and declaring an emergency; was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had; Ayes: Roberts, Klein, Clay, Mortensen and Mullan. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 706 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.


The Mayor opened the hearing on the extension of Lake Road Sewer and 37th Street sewer and called for objection to the same as described in the posted notices. There was no citizen present who made objection to this improvement. Ordinance Number 707 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Mortensen that Ordinance Number 707 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Ordinance Number 707 AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of a sanitary sewer trunk line along Lake Road and a sanitary sewer along 37th Street, north of Lake Road, and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Roberts, Klein, Clay, Mortensen and Mullan. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 707 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A petition, signed by all of the property owners in Block 2, Streib's First Addition, requesting that Block 2, Streib's First Addition be changed from 3 R-1 to Commercial Zone, was read. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Roberts that the petition be referred to the Planning Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Burdick proposed to the Council that six street lights be placed in Robertson's Addition and Birkemeier Addition, and that one street light be placed at 41st and Harvey Streets. The Council approved Mr. Burdick's recommendation.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Mortensen that the contract for constructing the sewers in Lake Road and 37th Street be granted to Luben & Son and that the Mayor be authorized to sign the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, on motion being duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
