

SPECIAL MEETING MAY 28, 1958

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held, for the purpose of hearings of the question of sanitary sewers in the Sellwood Gardens area and curb and sidewalk improvements on 33rd Street and 35th Street Quincy Addition, and such other business as was necessary to come before the Council at this time, on the twenty-eighth day of May, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan .

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick and Clerk Martin. Absent: Attorney Sheldahl.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the construction of sanitary sewers in the Sellwood Gardens area, and called for objections or remonstrances. There was no citizen present who protested and no written remonstrance had been filed. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Ordinance Number 716 was taken up and read. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Clay that Ordinance Number 716 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 716, AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of Sanitary Sewers in Sellwood Gardens, Ross Addition to Sellwood, Ross and Walkers Addition, and along Stubb Street and Short Street in Milwaukie Industrial Park, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 716 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the improvement of 33rd Street Quincy Addition from Washington Street to Wister Street, by curbs and sidewalks, and called for objections or remonstrances. There were six written objections. The objections were mostly based on the grade of the street. Manager Burdick reported that he had viewed the street with the Engineer and that the present grade provoked a problem and that a new grade of the street should be established, and he therefore recommended that this improvement not be made at this time. The Mayor called for objections to the Manager's recommendation. There were none. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Clay that the Council accept the Manager's recommendation and that 33rd Street be not improved by curbs and sidewalks until such time that the grade has been reestablished. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the improvement of 35th Street, from Washington Street to Lake Road, by curbs, sidewalks and drive-ways, and called for objections to the same. There was no objection or remonstrance. The Mayor declared the hearing closed. Ordinance Number 717 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was

moved by Klein and seconded by Roberts that Ordinance Number 717 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 717, AN ORDINANCE providing for the improvement of 35th Street by curbs, sidewalks and driveways, along both sides thereof, where none now exist or where such as do exist do not conform to City standards as to grades, alignment or construction, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance 717 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 718 was taken up and read. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Clay that Ordinance Number 718 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 718, AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure, without election, to annex certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 718 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
