

SPECIAL MEETING OF JUNE 3, 1958

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held, at the call of the Mayor, for the purpose of discussing ways and means of increasing the 1958-59 Budget and such other matters as were necessary to come before the Council at this time, on the third day of June, 1958.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Roberts and Klein; Manager Burdick and Attorney Sheldahl. Absent: Clerk Martin.

After discussion on the matter of increasing the 1958-59 budget expenditures, Ordinance No. 719 was read. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Clay that Ordinance No. 719 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 719, AN ORDINANCE providing for the calling of a special City Election in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the 17th day of June, 1958, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, the question of authorizing and directing the City Council of the said city to include in the budget and levy the sum of \$24,078.00 for the fiscal year 1958-1959 for general city purposes, which amount exceeds the constitutional six percent limitation on taxation set forth in Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon, and which amount is in addition to all other taxes levied.



Roberts and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 719 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The matter of hourly wage rates for laborers in the Street and Water Departments was discussed. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Clay that the pay rate for the hourly workers in the Street and Water Departments be increased by 25 cents per hour. Motion carried and so ordered.
