

MEETING OF FEBRUARY 13, 1956

COUNCIL CHAMBER

886th MEETING

The eight hundred eighty-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the thirteenth day of February, 1956

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Perkins, Shook and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred eighty-fifth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-third day of January, 1956, were approved as written.

A petition, for the vacation of that part of Adams Street which lies between Main Street and 21st Street, was laid before the Council. A majority of the property owners within a radius of four hundred feet from the proposed vacated portion of Adams Street had signed a statement that they did not object to the vacation. The Council gave the matter due consideration. It was moved by Clay and seconded by Shook that the prayer of the petitioners, that Adams Street, from Main Street to 21st Street be vacated, be denied. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 634, AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure without election to annex certain contiguous territory to the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing and fixing the effective date of this ordinance, was taken up and read in full for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Perkins, Shook and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 634 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Mr. Al Schmidt came before the Council and made inquiry as to what could be done about trees, growing in the parking area of the street, whose branches overhang in the street and become a hazard to certain types of traffic. Mr. Schmit pointed out a particular area, Harrison Street from 32nd Street to 34th Street where large limbs from trees would obstruct the moving of a dwelling. Mr. Schmidt was advised that while the trees are growing in the street area, they are the property and responsibility of the property owner, that the City has an ordinance requiring that branches projecting over the street must be trimmed to twelve feet above the street and eight feet above the sidewalks and that they (the Council) did not feel justified in ordering the branches cut back for one unusual piece of traffic, and recommended that the house movers contact the property owners of the trees for consent to do necessary trimming.

The Recorder announced that this was the time set for a hearing on the annexation of property now owned by School District No. 1 and contiguous to Martin Heights in the City of Milwaukie. It was shown that notices of the hearing had been given by posting and by publication in the Milwaukie Review. The Mayor called for objections to this annexation without election. There was no objection voiced. It was moved by Clay and seconded by Shook that an ordinance be drawn providing for the annexation, without election, of the tract of land, owned by School District No. 1, and contiguous to the Martin Heights Addition in the City of Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 635 was taken up and read in full for its first reading. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that Ordinance Number 635 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 635 AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 598 by deleting certain section numbers of Oregon Revised Statutes therefrom, and by substituting others therefor, and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read in full for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Perkins, Shook and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 635 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Clay that the following Resolution be adopted

BE IT, AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the appreciation of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, of the high type of citizenship exemplified by WARREN L. NOTT, and the creditable and honorable service which he rendered to the City, and further, the regret of said Council at his passing, be conveyed to his surviving relatives, and further, that a copy be spread upon the minutes of the proceedings of this body.

It was moved by Clay and seconded by Perkins that an ordinance be drawn providing for an annexation election to be held in the above mentioned area. Motion carried and so ordered.
