

MEETING OF JUNE 22, 1953

COUNCIL CHAMBER

823rd MEETING

The eight hundred twenty-third regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-second day of June, 1953

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan, Councilmen Shook, Clay, Klein and Wright; Manager Sperr and Attorney Kirkpatrick Absent: Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred twenty-second regular meeting of the Council, held on the eighth day of June, 1953 were approved as written and the minutes of the special meeting, held on the sixteenth day of June were read and approved as read.

Report of Marvin Runyan, Engineer, on the matter of furnishing disposal service to the Ardenwald Sanitary District, was submitted orally and in writing; His recommendation was to the effect that a contract for a period of five years be entered into with said Sanitary District at a monthly fee for such service of approximately \$575.00, this was based on an estimated population of Milwaukie for that period of 3730, and an estimated population of the Sanitary District of 2055, or 64.5% to the City of Milwaukie and 35.5% to the Sanitary District. Such contract to be made subject to review at the end of the five year period and adjusted in the amount to be paid in proportion to the then population of the City and District, and executed for an additional five year period.

Union High School District No.5 appeared by its Board of Directors, Clerk and Superintendant, and urged the issuance of a use permit for the erection of an addition to its gymnasium although the Planning Commission had made an adverse recommendation. Matter taken under advisement.

Ordinance Number 583 was placed on second reading; It was moved by Klein and seconded by Wright that Ordinance No. 583 do pass. The roll was called with the following result: Ayes: Mullan, Shook, Clay, Klein and Wright. Nays: None, Ordinance Number 583 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 584 was read for the first time. It was moved by Wright and seconded by Klein that Ordinance Number 584 be read the second time by title only and placed on final passage. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 584 was read the second time; moved by Wright and seconded by Klein that Ordinance Number 584 pass. The roll was called with the following results: Ayes: Mullan, Shook, Clay, Klein and Wright. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 582 Passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 585 was read for the first time. It was moved by Shook and seconded by Clay that Ordinance No. 585 be read the second time by title only. Motion carried. Ordinance read the second time. Moved by Clay seconded by Shook that Ordinance No. 585 be placed on final passage, Roll called with the following results: Ayes; Mullan, Shook, Clay, Klein and Wright. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 585 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

City Attorney was directed to prepare an ordinance for the regulation and licensing street peddlers.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Clay that the Mayor be authorized to enter into a contract with School District No. 64 of Clackamas County, Oregon, on behalf of the City of Milwaukie, for fire protection of said District's School Building at Clackamas, Oregon, upon the same terms as previously made for structures outside the City of Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Clay that the Mayor be authorized on behalf of the City of Milwaukie, to execute a contract with Vern John Best and Lydia Best, husband and wife for the conveyance of 16½ inches off the west end of Lots 5 and 6, Block 1 Leo's First Addition, to the City, in consideration of certain improvements to be made by the City. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter addressed to the Mayor and Council from Fred O. Roberts, J.W. Roberts, Ellen Roberts Martin, Emma Roberts Gritzmaker and Marguriette Roberts Clarke, commending the Council for placing a Plaque, honoring the City's First Council, on Pioneer Rock, was read and ordered filed.

A letter to the Mayor and Council, thanking them for placing the Plaque, honoring the First Council of Milwaukie, and signed by Otilia Shindler Burns, Rose Shindler Neidermeier and Louis Shindler, was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Wright that the following bills be allowed and that warrant-checks be drawn for the payment of same.
