

MEETING OF AUGUST 9, 1954

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

850th MEETING

The eight hundred fiftieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the ninth day of August, 1954

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Shook, Clay, Klein and Wright; Manager Sperr, Attorney Kirkpatrick. Absent: Recorder Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred forty-ninth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-sixth day of July, 1954, were approved as written.

Ordinance Number 603, AN ORDINANCE annexing the following described property:- All that part of Block 77, Minthorn Addition to the City of Portland, Oregon, which lies north of Railroad Avenue, except Lots 33, 34 and 35 in said Block 77, also Lots 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18, Block 4, Keil Heights Number 2, and Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9, Block 5, Keil Heights Number 2, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Mullan, Shook, Clay, Klein and Wright. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 603 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A letter, commending the Council for closing the south pedestrian lane at Monroe Street and McLoughlin Boulevard, from Zelda M. Stout, was read.

Bids for the improvement of Myrtle Street by curbs, sidewalks and driveways, were opened and read as follows:

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Clay that the bids be investigated by the Engineer and Manager and that the contract be awarded on the merit of its best advantage to the City. Motion carried and so ordered.

Bids for the repair of the City Hall roof were opened and read as follows:

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Clay that the bid of Tom Saunders, without the downspouts, be accepted subject to approval of the City Manager. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Clay that Mayor Mullan act as City Manager during the absence of Manager Sperr on account of illness. Motion carried and so ordered.

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Mr. Briggs, from the Iron Fireman, demonstrated and gave a talk on a heating system for the City Hall.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that the following bills be allowed and that warrants be drawn for the payment of same.
