

MEETING OF JANUARY 22, 1951

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

765th MEETING

The seven hundred sixty-fifth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty second day of January, 1951

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Mullan, Taylor, Klein and Norbeck, Manager Telford, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Treasurer Dillery, Auditor Hager, and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the seven hundred sixty-fourth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eighth day of January, 1951 were approved as written.

Auditor Hager presented to the Council his financial report. After some discussion, it was decided that the Council and Manager would meet with the auditor and carefully go through the report.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Mullan that a cost of living adjustment be made in the amount of \$10.00 per month for all monthly paid employees and that a like adjustment be made in salaries of hourly paid employees. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Taylor that the City accept the offer of the Housing Authority of the County of Clackamas for their sewer from station 5 plus 10 to the river, and that the Mayor be authorized to sign the agreement for same. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Mullan that Mr John Fezer be granted a permit to build a garage within five feet of his property line at Lot 13 Block A Kerr & Shindler Addn. provided said garage has a fire proof south wall with no openings. Motion carried and so ordered.

There was a discussion on the matter of the present fees charged for building permits. It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Klein that the Attorney draw an amendment to Section 1 of Ordinance 480 with regard to fees charged for building permits, and that the same be laid before the Planning Commission for their approval or recommendation. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Klein that easements for intercepting sewers be paid, subject to the approval of the City Attorney. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that the Manager be authorized to employ Mr. V. Corti to put culverts under City of Milwaukee Railroad in Kellogg Park. Motion carried and so ordered.

There was discussion with regard to license fees charged for pin ball and other coin operated machines. It was decided that Manager Telford would ascertain what other cities were doing along this line, and report to the Council.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Klein that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 546 AN ORDINANCE prescribing the rates on stand-by water service for fire protection sprinkler systems; and regulating the use thereof and payment of charges for same, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Sperr, Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 546 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Councilman Taylor suggested that as this was the time of year to prune trees, that the City have the trees overhanging the street at the north of the City Hall grounds, pruned to proper height over street and sidewalk, and that overhanging trees throughout the City be required to be properly pruned to conform to the ordinance.

Upon Motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
