

MEETING OF AUGUST 11, 1952

Council Chambers

802nd MEETING

The eight hundred and second regular meeting of the Council was held on the eleventh day of August 1952.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Taylor, Mullan, Klein and Norbeck; Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin.

Mr. D. A. Mallory, 2126 Monroe St. and Mr. J. Harbacheck, 2136 Monroe Street, came before the Council and made complaint of the house across the street from their property and asked that it be removed immediately. It was reported that the house was presently being emptied preparatory to its removal and that it would be superfluous to issue orders for this work to be done.

Lt. Col. I. D. Miller, Battalion Commander, 722nd Anti Aircraft Artillery Group and Captain Biglin, of the same group before the Council and requested that the Council state what they (Council) could do with regard

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to the placing of a temporary armory in Milwaukie. Lt. Col. Midler stated that if permitted to use the property, the Anti Aircraft Group would make the improvements, that, so far as he could say, the building would be a quonset hut set on concrete or black-top slab, and that they would like to know what the City could do toward this project. The Council discussed the matter and answered Lt. Col. Miller that they would give him their moral support; that they would permit the ground to be used at no expense but could not give any money nor specify exact time of termination of ground useage.

Mr. Horace Quigley requested the Council to change the zone for Lots 9 and 10 Block 2 Leo Addn. from 3R-1 to Commercial Zone, and presented a statement signed by owners of property in the vicinity stating that they had no objection to such change. Mr. Marvin Preston requested that the E'ly one half of Block 1 leo addn. be also changed to Commercial Zone. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Norbeck that the matter be referred to the Planning Commission for their recommendation. Motion carried and so ordered.

Acting Manager Sperr reported that the 27th Street Improvement was progressing and that the parking strip on both sides of the street will be taken off when new curbs are put in. He also reported the progress being made on the sewer in Harrison Street between 21st and 23rd Streets.

Fire Chief Lillis laid before the Council a proposed ordinance which would set up rules and regulations for the Fire Department and asked that it be adopted. Attorney Kirkpatrick stated that, in his opinion, the proposed Ordinance was in conflict with the spirit of the Charter. After some discussion it was decided that Manager Sperr would make an investigation of what other cities have along this line.

It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Taylor that the following bills be approved and that warrant-checks be drawn for the payment of same.
