

MEETING OF JANUARY 10, 1949

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

716th MEETING

The seven hundred sixteenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the tenth day of January, 1949.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Mortensen and Frady, Councilman elect Norbeck; Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick, and Recorder Ellen Martin.

Mr. Sperr and Mr. Norbeck were sworn in to their respective offices of Mayor and Councilman.

The minutes of the seven hundred fifteenth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-seventh day of December, 1948, were approved as written.

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Mr. C.V. Crispin came before the Council and made application to open his recreation room for card and shuffle board games for amusement. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mortensen that the Manager, Chief of Police and Fire Chief make inspection of the premises and, upon their approval of the same, the permit be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Garland Taylor was sworn in to office of Councilman and took his seat at the Council table.

It was moved by Frady that Mr. Clinton Russell and Mr. Eldon Smith be granted a permit to operate a pool room at 1218 Main Street. The fact that the pool room was a basement room and would cater to minors brought on considerable discussion, especially since the applicants had expressed the desire to install card tables, but had made it clear that the card tables would be for the use of adults only. The motion was lost for want of a second.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Taylor that Ordinance 173 be revoked and that the attorney prepare ordinances providing for the control of pool rooms and card rooms. Motion carried and so ordered.

Commander Ross, representative of Dixie Tank and Bridge Company, appeared before the Council and state that he had looked at the City's water storage tank and that the same is in much need of cleaning and repair. There was some discussion on the matter. In as much as the new storage reservoir is to be constructed as soon as the work can be begun, it was the conclusion of the Council that it would be well to avoid further expense at this time.

Mr. Frank Davis came before the Council and made a request for money for operating expenses of the Milwaukie Junior Olympic Club. It was explained to Mr. Davis that the City could not spend money for private clubs.

Ordinance Number 517 AN ORDINANCE licensing punchboard operators, providing a penalty, repealing conflicting ordinances and declaring an emergency, was taken up for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Sperr, Taylor, Mortensen, Frady, and Norbeck. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 517 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 518 was taken up for its first reading and read through. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mortensen that the rules be suspended and that Ordinance 518 be read for its second reading by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance 518, AN ORDINANCE licensing all coin operated machines, other than coin operated vending machines and music machines, providing a penalty, repealing conflicting ordinances and declaring an emergency, was read, by title only, for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Sperr, Taylor, Mortensen, Frady, and Norbeck. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 518 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Manager Taber reported to the Council that the present renter of unoccupied land in Kellogg Park would like to continue renting the property for truck gardening. It was agreed that the attorney draw an agreement with a "subject to sale of property" clause in the same and if the applicant will rent on that basis, that his offer be accepted.

Manager Taber brought before the Council an agreement, from the Southern Pacific Company, granting the City a right-of-way for a water drain ditch north of Harrison Street and paralleling the tracks of the Tillamook Branch R.R. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Frady that Frady that the Mayor be authorized to sign the agreement.

Attorney Kirkpatrick reported that he had talked with Dr. Fixott with regard to right-of-way through his property, for the service road on the east side of Highway 99E, but that nothing definite had been decided.

A letter from W.C. Charack, written in behalf of Fritz Hager, was read. The letter was in the form of a warning that, in the event the

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culvert under Washington Street at 27th Street should fail to properly function, that Mr. Hager would hold the City responsible for any damage done to his property.

It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Norbeck that Manager Taber call for bids for fuel oil for the City. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was agreed that Albert Combs Insurance Agency be asked to furnish the Recorder's Bond.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mortensen that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
