

MEETING OF MARCH 25, 1946

COUNCIL CHAMBER

649th MEETING

The six hundred forty-ninth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-fifth day of March 1946.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Nelson, Roberts and Rowe; Manager Kelsey, Auditor Phillips, Water Superintendent Hofmann, Officer Burbank and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the six hundred forty-eighth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eleventh day of March 1946, were read and approved as read.

Mr. A.Y. Alcorn, of the Southern Pacific Co. came before the Council and made inquiry as to the prospects of sewers and water supply being available for the industrial area in Kellogg Park. Mr. Alcorn stated that if these facilities were available he could place industries in this area which would be of great benefit to Milwaukie. The Mayor stated that there was to be a meeting of some of the zoning committee and Clackamas County Housing Authority representatives on Tuesday, March 26, and assured Mr. Alcorn that this matter would be taken up for consideration at this meeting.

Mr. Winkle, of the Pump, Pipe and Power Co. came before the Council and stated that the labor strikes in the east had delayed delivery of the Worthington Pump for the new well, but that he had received a telegram stating that the pump only would be shipped in a few days and that if the motor for this pump does not reach here by June 1, 1946 that his Company had another motor available which they would install. Mr. Winkle stated that Pump, Pipe & Power Co. would guarantee to have the pump installed and in running order by June 1.

Mr. Theo. Witt, speaking for Leonard Mullan, made application to have the grade set for curb on the west side of 28th Street south of Monroe Street. Mr. Kelsey pointed out that the City had no Transit with which to do engineering work, and that there would be much need of one in the near future.

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It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Nelson that the City purchase a Dietzen Transit. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Kelsey reported that the War Assets Corporation had called him stating that they had a G.M.C. 2½ ton, 1942 truck which the City could have for \$1,202.82. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that a committee including the Mayor, Manager and Fire Chief be authorized to purchase this truck for use in the Fire Department, provided the truck met with their approval after their inspection of same. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from Katherine Mason, Librarian, with reference to a request from the County Library to place a sign on the City Hall outside the Library, was read. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Rowe that the County Library be permitted to place this sign on the outside wall of the City Hall beneath the middle window at the west end of the Library. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that Manager Kelsey dispose of the band stand at the shore of Kellogg Lake. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 475 was taken up and read for the first time.

Ordinance Number 476 was taken up and read for the first time.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Roberts that Ordinances Numbers 475 and 476 be passed to their second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of the number of logging trucks now operating through Milwaukie was discussed. It was decided that Attorney Kirkpatrick and Manager Kelsey work out an ordinance which would control the manner of parking logging trucks.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Roberts that the Auditor Treasurer's financial report be accepted as presented. Motion carried and so ordered.

A petition, requesting that 35th Street between Wister Street and the north boundary of Fernwood Addition be graveled, and signed by owners of the property abutting this portion of 35th Street, was presented and read. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Nelson that Mr. Kelsey make investigation of the matter and recommend to the Council what action should be taken.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Rowe that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
