

MEETING OF APRIL 14, 1947

674th MEETING

The six hundred seventy-fourth regular meeting of the Council was held on the fourteenth day of April 1947.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Roberts, and Frady; Attorney Kirkpatrick, Water Superintendent Hofmann, and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the six hundred seventy-third regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-fourth day of March 1947 were read and approved as read.

Mr. C.O. Banks came before the Council and requested a permit to move a school bus body on to Lot 5, Block 2, Duerst's Addition. Mr. Banks stated that his purpose for moving the bus body was to use it as a shop and swelling. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Roberts that in as much as Mr. Bank's proposal would not conform to Ordinance 481, the permit be not granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

There was discussion about licensing dealers in certain commodities, whose places of business aren't in Milwaukie, but who sell and deliver within Milwaukie. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Hamlin that the Manager and Attorney investigate and interpret a proper ruling as pertaining to business license in Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Frady that the action of acting Manager Sperr in purchasing a new car for the Police Department be approved. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was decided that Attorney Kirkpatrick would contact Mr. Newman of Oregon City with regard to a radio for the Police car.

It was move by Frady and seconded by Roberts that the City purchase a centrifugal pump as authorized by acting Manager Sperr and Councilman Hamlin acting in conjunction for the purchase. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Roberts that a public hearing be held on the twenty-eighth day of April, at the regular meeting of the Council, with regard to the improvement and widening of 21st Street between Jackson and Jefferson Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Hamlin that the City pay \$50.00 for preliminary survey made for the Recreation Center. Motion carried and so ordered.

A petition, signed by property owners on both sides of Moss Street, between 31st Street and the main line S. P. tracks, requesting that this portion of Moss Street be vacated, was read. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Hamlin that the petition be referred to acting Manager Sperr for his investigation and recommendation. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Hamlin that an agreement submitted by the Portland Traction Co., with regard to water pipes crossing under their tracks at Hendee Station be not accepted and signed. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Councils' attention was called to the fact that on Front Street (99E) the old "20 mile per hour" signs, which do not conform to the States' present authorized speed of 25 miles per hour, were still standing. It was agreed that acting Manager Sperr have the signs removed and that he request the State Highway Dept. to paint signs on this highway warning traffic of the flashing signal at the intersection of Monroe Street.

The matter of a sewer pipe reported to be emptying into a manhole west of Front Street near Monroe Street was referred to acting Manager Sperr.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Roberts that the Water Department be authorized to submit bids for the purchase of the 30th Street and Monroe Street Sewer Improvement Bonds. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was decided that the Budget Committee would meet on Friday evening April 18.

Ordinance No. 493 was taken up and read in full for its first reading. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Roberts that Ordinance No. 493 be passed to its second reading and that the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read immediately for the second time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 493, AN ORDINANCE amending Sections 4,5,6, and 7 of Ordinance No. 492 and providing for the licensing of the Operators of HISTORY QUESTION GAMES AND GAMES OF LIKE CHARACTER and providing the manner in which such licenses are granted and the amount of the fees therefor, was taken up and read for its second-reading by title only and put on its passage with the following results being had Ayes; Sperr, Hamlin, Roberts, and Frady. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 493 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Roberts that the Mayor contact Mr. Jack Taber at Bend, Oregon and employ him as City Manager at a salary of \$3,600.00 per year. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was decided that Mr. Taber be invited to attend the meeting of the Budget Committee on Friday April 18.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Roberts that Mayor Sperr make available to the Milwaukie Review the qualifications of Mr. Taber in order that the information may be made to the tax-payers. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamline and seconded by Roberts that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same:
