of November 1946, at the call of the Mayor and Pursuant to Section 12 of the New Charter of Milwaukie, for the purpose of canvassing the returns of the regular and special election held on the fifth day of November 1946.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin and Nelson; Manager Kelsey, Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilmen Roberts and Rowe.

The returns of the regular election held on the fifth day of November 1946, at which candidates for City offices were voted upon, and the returns of the special election held on the fifth day of November 1946 at which the question of whether or not the sale of all alcoholic liquors should be prohibited in Milwaukie, were canvassed with the following results:

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the canvass of the votes of the two elections be accepted and approved. Upon roll call being taken on the motion the following results were had: Ayes, Sperr, Hamlin, and Nelson. Nays: None. Motion carried and so ordered.

Pursuant to Section 3 of the new City Charter it was decided that the Recorder would toss a coin to determine which of the Councilmen elected by the vote would serve for the four year term.

The two gentlemen matched coins to determine who should have the first choice, Mr. Hamlin being the winner chose heads, for the long term, the coin tossed by the Recorder alighted with the Buffalo up which decided the long term in favor of W. A. Frady.

Fred O. Roberts and W. A. Frady were declared to be elected Councilmen for Milwaukie until December 31, 1950 and Howard Hamlin was declared to be elected Councilman until December 31, 1948.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
