

MEETING OF APRIL 10, 1944.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS.

602nd MEETING

The six hundred second regular meeting of the Council was held on the tenth day of April 1944.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present. Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Newman, Bevington, McClure Sperr and Rowe; Treasurer Farrington, Water Superintendent Counsell Fire Chief Lewellyn, Officer Hartwick and Recorder Martin/

The minutes of the six hundred first regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-seventh day of March 1944 were read and approved as read.

The Fire Chief reported that he could not make recommendation that a building permit be granted for an addition to a building at 2135 Willard St. The matter was referred to the Fire Commission.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Sperr that the City's interest in Lot 26 Block 7 Quincy Addition, be sold to John C. and Jennie Corpman for the full amount of the City's Lien against same. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Newman that the City sell Lots 38-39-40 Block 71 Minthorn to Emanuel and Zerina Maas for the full amount of the City's Lien against same. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Newman that the Milwaukee Lumber Co. be granted a permit to build a shed addition to their building at 1146 21st Street. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder read a letter from the P.&C. Hand Forged Tool Co. in which they made application to have a stand-pipe connection installed on the 32nd street water main, since the water supply would be used only in the event of fire, they requested that the installation be made without a meter, but with a control valve, sealed by the Water Department. It was moved by Newman and seconded by Sperr that the P.&C. Hand Forged Tool Company's request be granted and that the other stand-pipe which they already have be equipped with a sealed valve. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that two Series "F" War Bonds be purchased with Water Department funds. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Newman that Four Series "F" War Bonds be purchased with funds from the General Sinking Fund. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by McClure that Ivar Tolstead be granted a permit to build a lattice trellis at the east end of the property of Lot 6 Block 30 Milwaukie, provided such trellis will not be a barricade in the event of fire. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Rowe that a street name sign be put up on Harrison street at McLoughlin Blvd. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Bevington that the Auditor-Treasurer report be accepted as reported to the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Rowe that the City allow the Police officer \$25.00 per month for upkeep of his car exclusive of gas and oil. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Sperr that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
