

MEETING OF JUNE 19, 1944

606th MEETING.

The six hundred sixth regular meeting of the Council was held, pursuant to adjournment on June 12, 1944, on the nineteenth day of June 1944.

In the absense of the Mayor the meeting was called to order by the Recorder.

Present: Councilmen Newman, Bevington, McClure, Sperr and Rowe, Treasurer Farrington, Auditor Phillips, Water Superintendent Counsell, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Martin. Absent: Mayor Roberts.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that Fred Sperr be elected President of the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Sperr presided at the meeting.

The minutes of the six hundred fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-second day of May 1944, were read and approved as read.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that the matter *Buss* of Buss Franchise be tabled indefinitely. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Rowe that the City sell Lots 13 and 16 Block 1 Quincy Addition to Mr. Edwin Lofthus for the amount of the City's Lien against the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Bevington that the City sell Lots 3 and 4 Block 9 Quincy Addition to Ralph McIntyre for the full amount of the City's Lien against same. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Rowe that the Water Department purchase three Series "F" Defense Bonds at a cost of \$2,220.00 Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that \$383.95 delinquent street improvement assessments and \$249.31 delinquent sewer assessments collected, be transferred to the General Fund 1943-44 Budget. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Bevington that \$1,726.02 be transferred from the 1943-44 General Fund to Street Fund to balance the account. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Bevington that the City purchase eight Series "F" Defense Bonds for General Fund. This amount together with all other unexpended budget amounts to be carried and credited to "Sinking Fund" for Addition and Betterment work at the close of the 1943-44 fiscal year as authorized by recent Legislature. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Bevington that the City put in a "Catch Basin" at the northeast corner of 29th and Washington streets providing the property owner paves the street to the curb line. Motion carried and so ordered.

A group of business men appeared before the Council with regard to the types of Coin vending machines that could be licensed in Milwaukie. Attorney Adams explained that Ordinance No. 441 was in accordance with Oregon Laws Chapter 369 and was drafted therefrom.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by McClure that an Ordinance amending Section 6 of Ordinance 441, to increase the number of machines permitted in the City, from 12 to 18, to be drawn and posted. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that the Recorder write to Attorney General Neuner for a decision on what are legalized types of coin vending machines. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that Mr. Bevington be authorized to purchase a pipe pusher for the Water Department. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Newman that the Auditor-Treasurer's report be accepted as presented. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Rowe that Mrs. Newman be authorized to have the interior of the City Hall re-decorated. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Bevington gave a report of the Sewage Disposal discussion at the State Convention of the League of Oregon Cities, and at the Council of Clackamas County Cities.

Fire Chief Lewellyn gave a report of the Building Code and Fire Prevention discussions at the convention of the League of Oregon Cities.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Newman that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
