

MEETING OF JULY 24, 1944

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

609th MEETING.

The six hundred ninth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-fourth day of July 1944.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilman Newman, Bevington, McClure and Sperr, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Officer Butler, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Rowe, Treasurer Walcott and Water Superintendant Counsell.

The minutes of the six hundred eighth regular meeting of the Council, held on the tenth day of July 1944, were read and approved as read.

The matter of the City purchasing a police car was discussed. The Recorder was directed to contact the War Production Board and learn what priority was necessary for the City to purchase a car.

Mr Sperr was appointed to attend a meeting of the State Sanitary Authority Advisory Group at Corvallis on Thursday July 27.

A remonstrance against piles of scrap lumber being dumped on residential property on 28th street, and a request that the City not grant a permit for a barn or shed to be built on the property, was read. A representative group of citizens from 28th street explained to the Council the reasons for their action in remonstrating against this fire hazard and nuisance. Fire Chief Lewellyn was requested to make investigation of the property in question and report to the Council. It was moved by Newman and seconded by Bevington that the remonstrance be filed. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Fire Chief was requested to make investigation of a fire hazard on Lot 1 Block 30, Milwaukie, where debris was being left.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that the City sell Lot 12 Block 1 Brownell's Acres to Victor Phelps for the full amount of the Lien against same. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Librarian's annual report was read and ordered filed.
