

MEETING OF AUGUST 14, 1944.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

310th MEETING

The six hundred tenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the fourteenth day of August, 1944.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Bevington, McClure and Rowe, Fire Chief Lewellyn, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilmen Newman and Sperr, Treasurer Walcott and Water Superintendent Counsell

The minutes of the six hundred ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-fourth day of July 1944, were read and approved as read.

The Fire Chief reported that he had made inspection of the pile of used lumber being dumped on a lot in Hoesly's Addition. Mr Lewellyn stated that while the lumber was dry, the grass on the lot had been cut and green grass was showing through the stubble which would lessen the danger of fire. Mr Lewellyn also reported that the fire hazard on Lot 1 Block 30 Milwaukie had been removed.

The matter of out-houses in Milwaukie was brought before the Council, the Recorder was directed to take steps to have owners of out-houses remove same.

A letter from the City Planning Commission, in which they submitted to the City Council a Charter providing for a City Manager form of government, and recommended that this question be placed before the voters for their approval or disapproval, was read. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that the Council accept the recommendation of the Planning Commission and place the proposed Charter before the voters at the regular election, on November 7, 1944. Motion carried and so ordered

It was moved by McClure and seconded by Rowe that an ordinance be drawn and posted providing for the vacation of Twenty-ninth street between the south boundary of Washington street and the north boundary of Madison street. Motion carried and so ordered

It was moved by McClure and seconded by Rowe that the matter of an Ordinance vacating a portion of 34th street be indefinitely postponed. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by McClure and seconded by Bevington that the insurance on the storehouse on Railroad Avenue be renewed with Mr. Harry Dean. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Bevington that an ordinance be drawn and posted authorizing the Council to regulate sprinkling privileges in Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder was requested to contact the Doctors in Milwaukie to ascertain the amount of their fee for inspecting hospitals and convalescent homes.

The Fire Chief's report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by McClure and seconded by Rowe that the Mayor appoint a committee to approve the house numbers for Strawberry Hill, Boley's Addition and Zender's Addition. Motion carried and so ordered. The committee approved the numbers submitted by the Recorder.
