

MEETING OF AUGUST 28, 1944

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

611th MEETING

The six hundred eleventh regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-eighth day of August 1944.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Newman, Bevington McClure and Rowe, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Officer Butler and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Perr, Treasurer Walcott and Water Superintendent Counsell.

The minutes of the six hundred tenth regular meeting of the Council, held on the fourteenth day of August 1944 were read and approved as read.

Mr. Clifford Zarley came before the Council and made inquiry as to how to go about having a sewer put in along Monroe St. between 29th street and Campbell street. The Recorder was asked to have Engineer Milln make a survey as to depth, size etc. for this sewer extension, and give his report at the next regular meeting of the Council.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that the Librarian's salary be \$75.00 per month to be effective as of July 1, 1944. Motion carried and so ordered.

Vacation → It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Bevington that the City employees be given one week of vacation with pay after six months of service, and two weeks vacation with pay after one year of service. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Rowe that the J.W. McCready Lumber Co, be given a permit to build bins for tiles on Lot 4 Block 1 Lewelling Park Addition. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Newman that the Treasurer--Auditor report be accepted as presented. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Rowe that the City purchase two series "F" Defense Bonds at \$740.00 each, from the water fund. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 449 AN ORDINANCE providing for the vacation of a portion of Twenty-ninth street, which lies in Sellwood's Addition to Quincy Addition, Milwaukie, was taken up for the first time and read. Ordinance number 449 was read the second and third times by title only with the consent of the Council and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Newman, Bevington, McClure and Rowe. Nays: None. Ordinance number 449 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by McClure that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same
