

MEETING OF OCTOBER 11, 1943

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

590th MEETING

The five hundred nintieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eleventh day of October 1943.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Bevington, Sperr and Rowe. Water Superintendant Counsell, Fire Chief Fenton, Officer Rigdon and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Newman and McClure and Treasurer Farrington.

The minutes of the five hundred eighty-ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-seventh day of September 1943, were read and approved as read.

Mr. Sperr reported that the committee appointed to work with Engineer Milln on the grade of Washington street between Main street and McLoughlin Blvd, had decided that the Engineer make a straight 5% grade between the two streets and that Mr. Jone's sidewalk be eight feet in width and be put in with the sidewalk and curb on the outside sidewalk line and the parking space of four feet be left next to his building to be used for shrubbery, and that Mr. Jones be permitted to put steps from his Washington street entrance, in this parking space.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that an Ordinance be drawn and posted establishing the grade of Washington street between Main street and McLoughlin Blvd. in accordance with the grade set by the Engineer. Motion carried and so ordered.

There was discussion about painting the street crossings and safety lanes for the school crossings. It was decided that the painting be done at this time.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Bevington that the Mayor and Mrs. Newman be empowered to have the outside woodwork of the City Hall painted. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that the two monuments on Monroe street at the Wilson tract, as established by Engineer Milln, be properly boxed and covered. Motion carried and so ordered.
