

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MARCH 8, 1937

The four hundred thirty-eighth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eighth day of March, 1937 in the Council Chambers.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders, Present: Mayor Sanders Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Mourer, Roberts and Wills, Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Elsing, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred thirty-sixth and four hundred thirty-seventh regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 8th and 22nd days of February, 1937, were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Councilman Burdick reported on the condition of the City Streets and recommended that the County road-grader be secured for a three day period to go over the streets. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that the City hire the County road-grader for a three day period to go over the City Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

Councilman Dell reported on the street lighting and recommended the relocating of street lights at 25th and Monroe Streets to a pole two hundred feet further east and also the relocating of the light at the intersection of Railroad Avenue and Harrison Street. After some discussion Councilman Dell stated that he would secure figures on the cost of relocating the lights in question.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Dell that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance providing for the increase of minimum water allowance, reducing the rate on the excess over the minimum from 12¢ to 5¢ per hundred cubic feet to users located within the City and from 22¢ to 10¢ per hundred cubic feet to users located without the City during the two months periods of July-August and September-October of each year. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that E. A. Stanley be employed on a month to month basis as traffic officer, effective March 15, 1937, at a salary of \$100 per month. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the City Engineer prepare specifications for a booster pump for the Water Department and that the Water Superintendent and Recorder advise pump manufacturers of such specifications and invite them to bid on supplying a pump. Such bids to be opened at the regular meeting March 22, 1937. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that the City do not favorably endorse any more beer license applications. Motion carried and so orderd.
