

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MARCH 22, 1937

The four hundred thirty-ninth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 22nd day of March, 1937.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders. Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Mourer, Roberts and Wills, Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Elsing, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams,

The following bids for furnishing a booster pump for the City Water Works were opened:

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that the bids be referred to the City Engineer for analysis and that he report on the same at the next meeting. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder reported the following offers for City property had been received:

R. F. Countryman - \$110 each for Lots 23 and 24, Quincy Addition.
C. D. Peters - \$110 for Lot 4, Block 11, Quincy Addition
R. M. Luse - \$32.50 each for Lots 7 and 8, Block 41, Minthorn Add.
Mildred Bishell - \$90.00 each for Lots 12 and 13, Block 12, Quincy Addition.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that each offer be accepted and that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to execute deeds conveying the City's title to the lots. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Mourer that the following

be appointed as members of the Milwaukie Boxing Commission -
W. F. Roberts, Chairman, M. J. Walsh and Wm. B. Perry. Motion carried
and so ordered.

Councilman Dell reported that it would cost \$12.50 to move the
Street light at 25th and Monroe Streets two hundred feet further east and
\$12.50 to move the light at Harrison Street and Railroad Avenue west across
the Southern Pacific Tracks. It was moved by Wills and seconded by Burdick
that the moving of the two lights be authorized. Motion carried and so
ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that the Recorder
prepare and post an ordinance increasing the license fees on pin ball ma-
chines to \$25.00 per month. Motion carried and so ordered.

L. A. Maple applied for a loading zone in front of the Justice of
Peace's quarters. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Roberts that
the application be approved. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
