

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, AUGUST 9, 1937

The four hundred forty-eighth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 9th day of August, 1937.

The meeting was called to order by acting Mayor Burdick. Present: Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Mourer and Roberts, Water Superintendent Bevington, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Marshal Stanley, and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred forty-sixth and four hundred forty-seventh regular meetings held respectively on the 12th and 26th days of July, 1937 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

C. E. Peters offered to purchase the City's interest in Lots 16 and 17, Block 11, Quincy Addition, Milwaukee for \$135. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Roberts that the City's interest in Lots 16 and 17, Block 11, Quincy Addition be sold to C. E. Peters for \$135.00 and that the Mayor and Recorder be authorized to execute a deed covering the City's interest in said lots to Mr. Peters. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Roberts that a street designation sign be placed at thirty-seventh and Harrison Streets and that 20 mile speed limit signs be placed at the entrances to the City. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Roberts that J F. Roberts be given notice at once to vacate the East Milwaukie Fire Hall. Motion carried and so ordered.

Herman Ledding appeared before the Council and announced the donation to the City of four drinking fountains by the Milwaukie Business Men's Club. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Roberts that the gift be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.
