

Milwaukee Wis Aug. 10, 1909

The 88 Regular Meeting of the common Council was called to order by Recorder Dowling, Mayor Streit being absent.

Those present were Councilmen Kelso, Sellwood, Mallan and Lehman. Recorder Dowling Marshal W^m Kelso

The minutes of the 87 regular meeting were read and approved.

The following bills were read and allowed

The bills of the Portland Ry. Light & Power Co. for Street & Meter Lighting for months of June & July. were refused and the Recorder was instructed to communicate with said company and inform them that according to the franchise held by them that this city is entitled to Portland Rates

On Motion by Sellwood "carried" that a charge of Ten dollars (\$10) per night be charged for the use of the City Hall to all outside talent or parties desiring to rent same

On Motion by Lehman "carried" the chair was asked to appoint committee to prepare the town jail to take care of prisoners by providing cots and necessary bedding. The chair appointed the

Police committee

On Motion by Sellwood "carried" the Portland Ry Light & Power Co. were granted the privilege of filling in with dirt & gravel that part of Water Street crossing what is known as the "Mill Race" and the Recorder was instructed to so notify said company.

Councilman Sellwood then made a motion that the bridge crossing the mill race where it enters into the river be put in repair and the Street committee was so instructed.

In regard to the proposed ordinance to authorize J. F. Johnson his successors or assigns to construct, maintain and operate a water system and lay all necessary water pipes in all that portion of Milwaukee lying east of the Southern Pacific Railway track, it appearing by the certificate of the Marshal duly filed that a true copy of said proposed ordinance was by said Marshal duly posted for a period of 15 days beginning the 8th day of July, 1909 at the Post-Office in Milwaukee. The bill for said proposed ordinance was read the first time and by unanimous consent the rules were suspended and said bill was passed to a second reading. Said bill was then read a second time and by unanimous consent the rules were suspended and said bill was passed to a third reading. Said bill was then read a third time and was put to vote upon its passage. The roll was called and the following voted yes Kelso, Sellwood, Mullan and Lehman. Thereupon said ordinance number 28 was declared duly adopted. Upon motion motion of Kelso, unanimously carried, the title of said bill was declared to be the title of the ordinance.

The title of said ordinance being as follows.
Ordinance # 28 An ordinance authorizing J. F. Johnson his successors or assigns to construct, maintain and operate a water system and lay all necessary water pipes in all that portion of the city of Milwaukee lying east of the Southern Pacific Railroad track.
