

- Milwaukie, Ore. Aug. 7, 1905.

The 40th Meeting of the Common Council was called to order by Mayor Shindler.

Those present were councilmen, Streib, Hively, & Kelso, Treas. Leckler, Marshal Dowling, Recorder Cooper & Councilman Webster, absent.

The minutes of the special meeting were read and approved as read.

The first business being the repeal of Ordinance No 10, moved by Streib, seconded by Kelso. Kelso = yes, Hively = yes, Streib = yes, Streib moved that rule be suspended for second reading, seconded by Kelso. Kelso = yes, Streib = yes, Hively = yes, moved by Hively that rule be suspended & that ordinance No 10 be brought up for 3^d reading. Seconded by Kelso. Streib = yes, Hively = yes, Kelso = yes.

Ordinance No 14 was then taken up. Moved by Streib, seconded by Kelso, that clerk call the roll. Streib = yes, Kelso = yes, Hively = yes. Moved by Kelso that rule be suspended, seconded by Streib, so carried. Kelso, yes, Hively, yes, Streib, yes; Moved by Hively, that rule be suspended for third reading, seconded by Kelso, Streib, yes, Kelso = yes, Hively = yes. Ordinance No 14 was passed on third reading and approved. Mr. Hagenburger made a complaint that the city taxes were assessed higher than the county

Taxes, which was corrected. A petition was presented to enforce the pound law within the limits of the town, but was laid on the table till next meeting.
