

Town Hall June 29 - 1909

The adjourned meeting of the 86th Regular meeting was called to order by Mayor Streib. Councilman present were, Kelso, Sellwood, Mullan and Lehman. Recorder Dowling and Marshal Wm Kelso.

The purpose of the meeting was stated by the Mayor and the franchise granting J. I. Johnson right to lay water mains etc., in that portion of Milwaukee lying East of the Southern Pacific Ry., was read.

Moved by Lehman 2nd by Kelso ^{carried} that that franchise be taken up for passage. Roll call resulted as follows
Kelso "yes" Sellwood "yes" Mullan "yes"
Lehman "yes"

Moved by Kelso seconded by Sellwood carried that rule be suspended and franchise be taken up for 2nd reading.

Roll call resulted as follows
Kelso "yes" Sellwood "yes" Mullan "yes"
Lehman "yes"

Moved by Sellwood seconded by Mullan carried that rule be suspended and that franchise be taken up for final reading. Roll call Resulted as follows
Kelso "yes" Sellwood "yes" Mullan "yes"
Lehman "yes"

Moved by Mullan seconded by Lehman carried, that the City appropriate Forty Dollars (\$40) to help defray the expense of oiling Main Street

The attention of the Council was called to the fact that Mrs Jos. Mcindal was appropriating certain streets in Minthorn Addition to his own private use by piling cord-wood thereon, and after having been given 30 days notice to remove same had failed to comply with same. The matter was left with the Recorder to see that he comply with the order forthwith.
