

Town Hall Milwaukee Ore

Feb 9th 1909

The 82nd Regular meeting of the Common Council was called to order by Mayor Streib. Councilman present, were J. R. Kelso T. R. A. Sellwood J. S. Mullanrd W. F. Lehman. The minutes

of the previous meeting were read and approved as read. Councilman Kelso reported on bill of P. R. Lnd P. Co. for meter lighting, for month of Dec which was referred to light committee at previous meeting, had been investigated, and found the usual rate had been charged on same, and reported we would have to use considerable more light before we would be entitled to a reduction in rates.

Mr Eddy of the Right of Way department of the Willaburg Beaverton Ry submitted plans, blueprints, and a proposed ordinance to the council for their future consideration.

and requested that a committee be appointed to confer with representatives of the company. A committee of the council as a whole the Mayor included decided to meet with a representative of the company Tuesday Feb 16th at 1 o'clock and look over the proposed route. A request from the fire company for additional hose and other apparatus was read and referred to the finance committee.

A Petition from Citizens and property owners in Lewellyn Park, an addition adjoining Milwaukee on the North, requesting the council take the necessary steps and enact legislation to annex that territory known as Lewellyn Park & Milwaukee was read and referred to Street and Public Property committee.

A Petition from the Milwaukee Telephone Co requesting the ^{82nd portion} use of the West side of Main St. opposite the store of the Milwaukee Mercantile Co for a period of 30 days to unload and prepare poles was granted by the council.

A Petition from property owners in Kerr & Shindler's addition was read. Petition followed.

We the undersigned property owners of Milwaukee Oregon Clackamas County would respectfully ask that you take proper proceedings to continue the opening of Patton Avenue, through a strip of land of about 300 ft owned and occupied by Mrs E V Sellwood. Said Street to be 50 feet wide.

the same was referred to the Street Committee with power to commence proper proceedings. Street Committee reported sidewalk of Mrs Dora Quant had been repaired but that the foot-bridge adjoining Dr Patton's property on Washington St had not been repaired and received instructions to put same in repair at once and all costs to be charged to property.

Estimates on cost of completing reading room were read and on motion by Councilman Mullan it Finance Committee was authorized to advertise for bids the room to be finished same as Hall above.

Finance report showed a balance in hands of Treasurer of \$618.10. On motion by Councilman Kelsa the Recorder was instructed to notify the Pacific States Telephone Co to comply with section 4 of the franchise they hold with city, which provides for a free Telephone for the city, and was directed further to notify said company that the council desired said phone installed at once in the Town Hall.

Mr J. P. Shaw, editor of the Milwaukee Record was introduced by the mayor and submitted a proposition for the erection of a local municipal electric lighting plant. He said that local capital stood ready to put in a power plant to furnish lights,
