

Ordinance No 24

Relating to Elections.

The Town of Hillsboro doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. Fifteen days prior to every annual election of Town officers of the Town of Hillsboro the Town Recorder shall post three notices in public places of the Town, in form as provided in the General Election Laws of the State of Oregon.

Section 2. Not less than ten days prior to every such election the Board of Trustees shall appoint three Judges of Election from among the qualified electors of the Town, and the Town Recorder shall cause notices of appointment to be forthwith served upon each of such judges, and shall furnish them suitable poll books and ballot box for holding such election.

Section 3. At all elections held under this ordinance the Polls shall open at 8 o'clock in the forenoon, and continue open till 1 o'clock in the afternoon; Provided the Judges of election, may protract the closing of the Polls till 5 o'clock.

Section 4. The Judges of election shall meet at the appointed time and all vacancies filled and proceedings had thereafter as is provided in the General Election Laws of the State of Oregon so far

as the same can apply to elections of the Town of
Hillsboro.

Section 5) Said Judges shall make return within
one day from the closing of the Polls, to
the Town Recorder, and such Recorder calling to his
aid two Trustees of the Town, shall proceed to canvas
the returns and shall make and enter an abstract
thereof in the record of the proceedings of this Board
and it shall be the duty of such Recorder immediately
to issue certificates of election to the five persons
having the highest numbers of votes for Trustees,
and to the persons each having the highest
number of votes for Treasurer, Recorder and mar-
shal. Provided that when a tie shall exist between
two or more persons having the highest vote for
any office of the Town, the Recorder shall give
notice to each of such persons having an equal and
the highest number of votes to attend at a time
fixed within five days from such notice, and then
proceed publicly to decide by lot which of the persons so
tied shall be declared duly elected and the Recorder shall
issue certificates of election according to such
lot.

Sec 6) Any person voted for at any election held under
this ordinance may within five days after the canvas
of votes by the Town Recorder demand a recount of the
votes cast for and against such person, such demand
shall be in writing and shall be served on the
Town Recorder in like manner as a summons is served
in Courts of Record of this State. Within five days
after such demand for a recount, and after not less
than two days notice to each of the persons directly inter-
ested in such recount the Board of Trustees shall
convene and publicly count the votes cast for and
against the person demanding such recount and cer-
tificate of election shall be issued in accordance with
such account, by the Recorder retiring from office, Provided
that if upon the Board so counting the votes, the
person demanding such shall not be declared elected
he shall be held to pay the costs and expenses of
such proceeding.

Section 7) As there is no Ordinance now in force regulating
elections of the Town of Hillsboro this Ordinance
shall take effect five days after its passage
