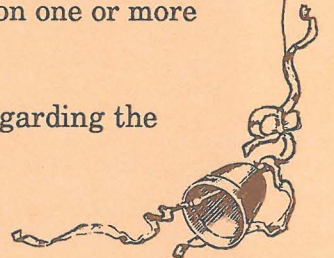
## PARK DISTRICT PASSES

"Voters approved the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District, and residents can expect to see some immediate impacts," states Don Robertson, Milwaukie Parks and Recreation Coordinator.

Milwaukie will receive operating funds for City parks and the Center from the district beginning July 1, 1991. These pass through funds will continue for five years. In July, 1995, the district will absorb the Milwaukie Parks Department and the Center.

"We are really excited by the prospects. If area residents want to become involved, there are several ways," says Robertson. One way is to become a member of the Parks and Recreation Commission. The Commission will continue to serve the City Council in an advisory capacity. Some residents may wish to serve on the Regional Advisory Board or to work on one or more project task forces.

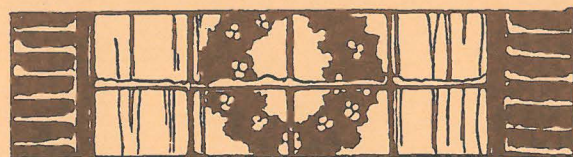




## More Holiday Safety Tips

### PROTECT YOUR HOME

- Don't display gifts where they can be seen from a window or doorway.
- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave the house, even for a few minutes.
- Teach your children not to play with tree lights or electric connections.
- Immediately after the holidays, mark new gifts with your license number or other ID number.
- Use only fire resistant ornaments on your tree and make sure lights are in good working order. Place the tree in wet sand to keep it green.
- Never burn Christmas wrappings in your fireplace.
- If you go away, get an automatic timer for your lights and radio. Turn down the bell on your phone. Have a neighbor watch over the house, shovel snow, pick up the mail, and park in the driveway from time to time.



## Milwaukie Fire Rescue Christmas Program

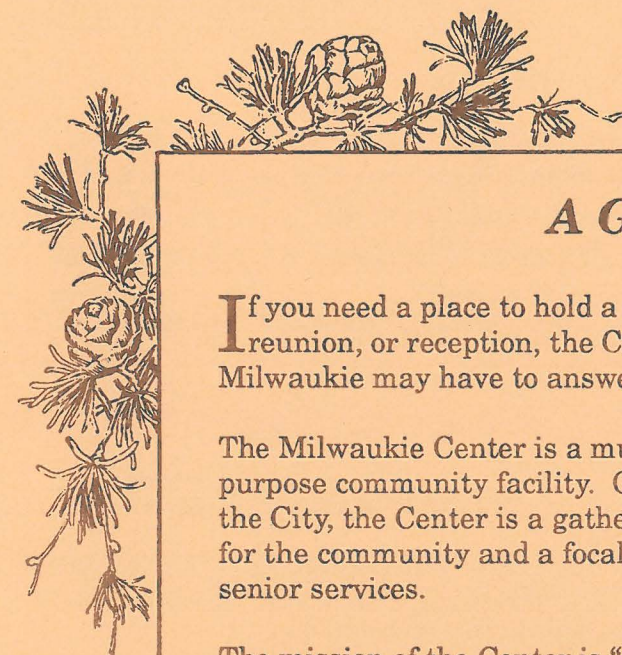
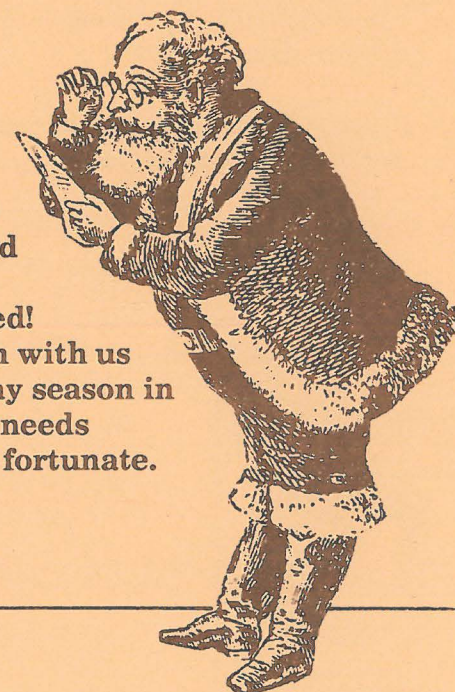

The Milwaukie Center is a multi-purpose community facility. Operated by the City, the Center is a gathering place for the community and a focal point for senior services.

The mission of the Center is "to serve the senior citizens and the community in the North Clackamas area." Priority is given to services which help the frail and elderly remain independent. The Center is committed to providing and coordinating programs and general services primarily to the elderly as well as providing space for general community use.

Beginning Wednesday, January 2, the City will be accepting reservations for picnic facilities at North Clackamas Park.

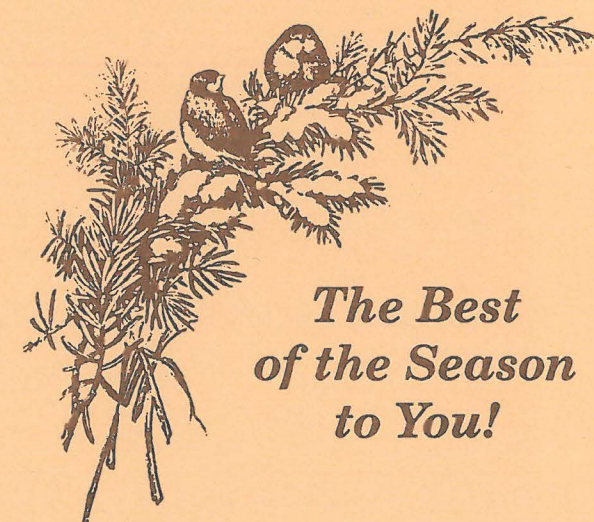
Facilities include a covered picnic area with electrical outlets and access to water. This area accommodates 250 people with 20 - 25 picnic tables. The non-covered picnic areas accommodate up to 100 people. Rental fees range from \$15 to \$100 depending on the facility and the day of the week.
