**WHEREAS** the City of Milwaukie, through acts of the City Council and with funds from the Government of the United States of America and from the sale of voter approved General Obligation Bonds, built the City Hall building located at 10722 SE Main Street; and


**WHEREAS** the City Hall building was dedicated and celebrated through a series of public events and activities July 7-11, 1938; and

**WHEREAS** the City Hall building has continued its service to the citizens of the City of Milwaukie for 75 uninterrupted years since 1938; and


**WHEREAS** a grateful City wishes to acknowledge the significance of the City Hall building and its seven-and-a-half decades of service to the "Dogwood City of the West"; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, I, Jeremy Ferguson, Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, hereby proclaim September 6, 2013, as Milwaukie City Hall Diamond Jubilee Day. I call upon public officials, historians, students, and all the people of Milwaukie to observe this day, to celebrate the faithful service of the people's hall in this City, and to recognize the important role this building plays in our ability to do the people's business with appropriate ceremonies, activities, and programs.
