PROCLAMATION



WHEREAS, THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES HAS PROCLAIMED THE WEEK OF MAY 13, 1985 AS NATIONAL POLICE WEEK AND MAY 15, 1985 AS NATIONAL POLICE MEMORIAL DAY.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RONALD KINSELLA, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, WITH THE UNANIMOUS CONSENT OF THE CITY COUNCIL, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF MAY 13, 1985 AS NATIONAL POLICE WEEK AND MAY 15, 1985 AS NATIONAL POLICE MEMORIAL DAY. I CALL UPON THE RESIDENTS OF MILWAUKIE TO JOIN US IN EXPRESSING OUR APPRECIATION TO THE MILWAUKIE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THEIR DEDICATION TO OUR COMMUNITY'S SECURITY.
