Biographical Sketch of Robert D. Carnahan:

Assistant Fire Chief Rob Carnahan is the Administration Chief of Clackamas County Fire District No. 1. The Fire District, a CFAI accredited agency, has over 150 employees and 60 volunteer fire fighters, including chaplains, and support personnel. Rob is primarily responsible for legislative and governmental affairs, community and business relationships, district communications, emergency management, public education and information services, and the fire marshal's office Formerly, the Fire Chief of Clackamas County Fire District No. 54 Chief Carnahan was instrumental in shaping the organizational structure that resulted in the successful consolidation of eight of Clackamas County's fire agencies.

Chief Carnahan's fire service career began in 1974 and includes; volunteer fire fighting, paid fire fighting and incident command, including being certified as an EMT Paramedic. He has held the ranks of; a Fire Fighter-Paramedic, an Inspector, Fire Marshal, Assistant Fire Chief, Fire Chief and as an elected Fire District Director.
