WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie is proud to partner with American Legion Post 180 to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War, and to recognize the men and women who served our nation during that conflict and all conflicts, and in times of peace; and

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie wishes to recognize and appreciate the many known and silent sacrifices made by the men and women who have served our country, in the hope that all people may enjoy the fruits of justice and liberty today and in the future.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jeremy Ferguson, Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, a municipal corporation in the County of Clackamas, in the State of Oregon, do hereby proclaim **November 11th**, 2014, to be **Veterans Day** in the City of Milwaukie, and do commend its observance to all citizens of the *Dogwood City of the West*.
