

ORDINANCE NO. 311

An ordinance establishing the grade on Sixteenth Street between Northwest Avenue and Eighth Avenue.

WEST LINN DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

217.00 feet elevation on the center of Sixteenth Street at the south line of Northwest Avenue.

217.60 feet elevation on the center of Sixteenth Street at 100.0 feet south of the south line of Northwest Avenue.

217.2 feet elevation on the center of Sixteenth Street at the north line of Eighth Avenue.

Reference is hereby had to the official mark at the westerly approach to the Oregon City Bridge, having an elevation of 107.74 feet.

Read the first time at an adjourned session of the Council held December 23, 1930.

Read the second time and passed at a regular session of the Council held January 7, 1931.
