RESOLUTION NO. 13-03

A RESOLUTION SUBMITTING A MEASURE AMENDING SECTION 58 OF THE OREGON CITY CHARTER TO ELIMINATE THE WATER RATE SETBACK TO THE ELECTORS OF OREGON CITY

WHEREAS, the City Commission has proposed a measure that would amend the Oregon City Charter, Section 58 regarding water rates; and

WHEREAS, because the City Commission does not have the power to adopt an amendment to the Oregon City Charter, that power is reserved to the electors of Oregon City.

NOW, THEREFORE, OREGON CITY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A regular city election is called in and for the City of Oregon City, to be held Tuesday, May 21, 2013. The Clackamas County Clerk shall conduct the election.

Section 2. At that election, the question of whether to amend Section 58 of the Oregon City Charter to read as follows:

The commission may not increase water rates by more than 3 percent annually without a vote of the people. The commission may not declare any ordinance or resolution establishing water rates to be an emergency nor use any other means to prevent their referral to the voters.

shall be submitted to the voters of Oregon City.

Section 3. The City Commission adopts the ballot title attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A to describe the measure and directs the City Manager to file the ballot title with the City Recorder.

Section 4. The City Commission directs the City Recorder to take all actions necessary to hold the election, including publication of the notice of receipt of the ballot title.

QUESTION: Shall the Oregon City Charter be amended to eliminate a provision

requiring the setback of water rates to 1994 levels?

SUMMARY: Section 58 of the Oregon City Charter contains a provision that requires water rates to be set back to those in place in 1994, with certain additional

increases. This measure would eliminate this provision and allow the City's

current water rates to remain in effect.

Section 58 of the Oregon City Charter was adopted in 1996 and both limited future water rate increases to three percent annually and required water rates to be set back to 1994 rates. The resetting of the water rates did not occur in 1996 because of a court decision to protect bond holders. Those bonds are scheduled to be repaid in 2014 and, if this provision is not adopted, water rates would be set back to 1994 water rates, plus those

increases of not more than three percent annually.

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PROPOSED REVISIONS MEASURE 58

Section 58 - Water Rates.

Upon passage of this amendment to the City Charter city water rates shall be those in effect as of October 31, 1994. The commission may not increase water rates by more than 3 percent annually without a vote of the people. The commission may not declare any ordinance or resolution establishing water rates to be an emergency nor use any other means to prevent their referral to the voters

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
