

RESOLUTION NO. 4-1998

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON,
ESTABLISHING FISCAL YEAR 1998-1999 NORTH CLACKAMAS
PARKS AND RECREATION DISTRICT (NCPRD) MILWAUKIE
NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS FUNDING.**

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie has an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with the NCPRD;

WHEREAS, such IGA provides for a total of between \$500,000 and \$800,00 (in 1990 dollars) funding and resources for land acquisition and the development of neighborhood parks facilities within the City of Milwaukie, between 1991 and 1996;

WHEREAS, the NCPRD may undertake improvements to parks currently under the jurisdiction of the City of Milwaukie subject to the approval of the City Council, or its designee;

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie has existing master plans for Ardenwald, Scott, Furnberg, and Water Tower Parks;

WHEREAS, in the IGA, the City of Milwaukie has listed as possible projects for neighborhood parks funding the acquisition of land for neighborhood or mini-parks, build neighborhood parks, build mini-parks or vest parks, improve or rehabilitate existing parks, expand existing parks facilities, etc.;

WHEREAS, the Milwaukie Parks and Recreation Board (PARB) is an advisory board to the City Council;

WHEREAS, the PARB met on Monday, January 5, 1998, at 6:30 PM and developed and prioritized projects for funding for the NCPRD fiscal year 1998-1999 budget, for Milwaukie neighborhood parks;

WHEREAS, the City Council and the PARB met in a public work session on Tuesday, February 3, 1998, to discuss proposed projects for NCPRD funding in fiscal year 1998-1999;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Milwaukee that the following prioritized list of projects and programs for 1998-1999 shall receive NCPRD neighborhood and NCPRD funds in fiscal year 1998-1999 in the listed priority order:

Fiscal Year 1998-1999:

1. Fund land acquisition prioritized as follows; first Neighborhood Parks and second Community and Regional Parks.
 - 1.1. Acquire additional land for neighborhood park development. First priority to be given to the Hector Campbell neighborhood and second to the Lewelling neighborhood.
 - 1.2. Acquire additional land for Community or Regional Parks for ballfields and skateboarding/rollerblading.
2. Upgrade existing facilities to meet expanding needs.
 - 2.1. Furnberg Park -- using Metro Open Spaces funding complete wetlands and for board walk completion in future years
 - 2.2. Water Tower Park -- complete construction as per master plan after plan adopted by City;
 - 2.3. Century Park -- evaluate existing facilities with the Lake Road Neighborhood Association; improve as recommended by Neighborhood Association and PARB.
 - 2.4. Wichita Park -- construction as per master plan.
 - 2.5. Spring Park -- develop master plan with the Island Station Neighborhood Association.
 - 2.6. Dogwood Park/McLoughlin -- on hold through fiscal year 1998/99.
3. Maintain existing facilities and programs.
4. Acquire facilities for youth activities such as skateboard/rollerblade park.

Recommendations not requesting neighborhood parks funds:
5. Develop youth programs through partnerships with citizens and public and private entities.
 - 5.1. Provide a skateboard/rollerblade program.
 - 5.2. Provide structured events in the summer throughout the community for children.
6. Improve communications to the community through intergovernmental cooperation, marketing, and promotional activities.
 - 6.1. Develop a plan for distribution of program and facility information through Neighborhood District Associations and other City-Wide communication tools such as the PILOT, IVBB, Home Page.


