A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, RECOGNIZING "OCTOBER AS CRIME PREVENTION MONTH"

WHEREAS, crime and the fear of crime adversely influences the well-being and the quality of life of all citizens and institutions in our community; and

WHEREAS, the monetary loss, personal injury, and community deterioration resulting from crime are intolerable; and

WHEREAS, citizen crime prevention action has demonstrated successful in reducing crime; and


WHEREAS, it is imperative to continue to distribute crime prevention information to the public and advocate its involvement in crime prevention programs in order to help reduce the number of crime victims; and

WHEREAS, crime prevention adds immeasurably to the health, safety, and vitality of our community and should be encouraged and supported by government agencies, businesses, schools, community groups, and neighbors; and


WHEREAS, crime prevention programs require the support of all citizens; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Milwaukie does hereby proclaim October 1992 as Crime Prevention Month in Milwaukie and recommend all citizens, government agencies, public and private institutions, and businesses to expand their understanding of and participation in effective crime prevention measures.
