A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE REGARDING HUMAN RIGHTS.

WHEREAS, a local family, the Richardsons, have been the victims of harassment and several unprovoked attacks which appear to be racially motivated and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that such prejudice and the practice of discrimination against any individual or group because of race, color, creed, sex, national origin or ancestry are inimical to the public peace and welfare of the City,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Milwaukie that the City supports the efforts of Omark Industries and other organizations and individuals seeking to prevent future racially-oriented incidents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the policy of the City to:

- 1. Promote mutual understanding and respect among all racial, religious, and nationality groups and to work to discourage and prevent discriminatory practices against such groups.
- Assist various groups and agencies in the community in educational campaigns devoted to the elimination of group prejudices, racial or area tensions, intolerance and discrimination.
- Insure that all City employees deal with the public in a manner which develops respect for equal rights and which results in equal treatment for all persons.
- 4. Provide that no person in the city is deprived of equal services furnished by the city by reason of discrimination and prejudice on account of race, color, creed, sex, national origin or ancestry.
- 5. Cooperate with federal, state and local agencies in promoting better human relations and the need for mutual self-respect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the North Clackamas Human Relations Council as an indication of the City's commitment to human rights.
